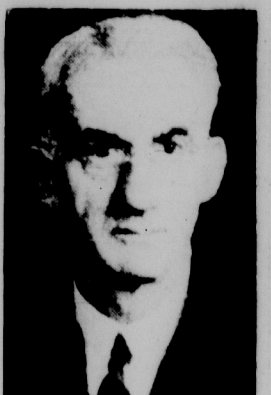
Homecoming Prize Retired; Chi Omega Light Stops Judges
