Backfield Coach Will Leave for Arizona March 1

There's at least one opening in Michigan State's athletic department Saturday—created by the resignation Thursday of Miles W. (Mike) Casteel to become head football coach at the University of Arizona.

Although Athletic Director Ralph H. Young declined to comment on a succession to Casteel, it was learned yesterday State probably will hire two men to fill the job which Casteel has handled since 1934.
