Votes Alone Do Not Bring Utopia

Students voted yesterday in an overwhelming majority in favor of adoption of the proposed new Student Council constitution. This favorable vote is viewed as a significant fact in that the Michigan State college students are widely interested in student government, and that they are willing to endorse a serious attempt to improve this government.

It would be a mistake, however, to suppose that after voting "yes" on the new constitution all the work needed to bring forth an adequate, democratic campus government had been done. Further acceptance of the new constitution by the student body is necessary.

The new constitution provides for a representative body of the student body, the Student Council, to be elected by the student body. The council will have the power to propose and pass resolutions, and to elect and remove officers of the student body.

The council will also have the power to elect and remove the Student Council Executive Committee, which will be responsible for the day-to-day operation of the student government.

The council will also have the power to elect and remove the Student Council Judiciary, which will be responsible for the enforcement of the student government's rules and regulations.

The council will also have the power to elect and remove the Student Council Finance Committee, which will be responsible for the collection and disbursement of student government funds.

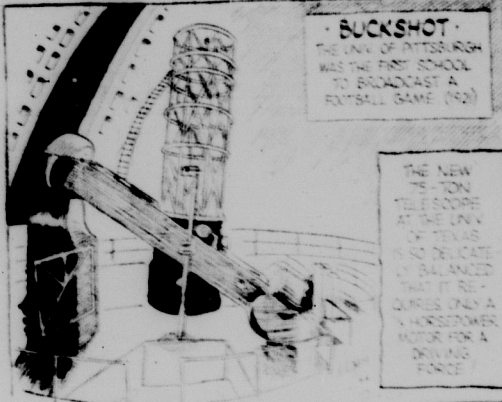

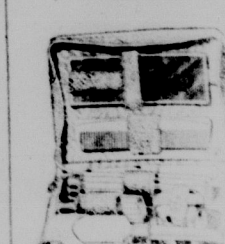

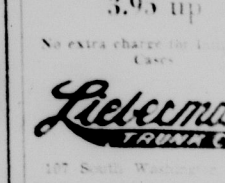

May Building Exceeds '38 Program

A comparison of figures reveals building in East Lansing through May, 1939, to be more than twice the amount of building done in a similar period in 1938.

Permits for the first five months of this year show permits have been issued for \$322,375 worth of buildings and alterations as compared to a total of \$123,300 for the first five months of 1938.

Impetus was given the building increase of this year by permits for two buildings, one for \$30,000 and the other for \$40,000. However, even without these two buildings, permits have registered a hundred per cent gain this year so far.

Also a notable factor was that the gain was not confined to amounts granted, but the number of permits granted jumped from 12 last year to 43 this year.

The past month, May, revealed the greatest trend in this direction for this year.

Figures for 1938 show six permits issued for the amount of \$46,000, whereas figures for 1939 show 16 permits issued for the amount of \$140,425. Among these 16 permits are the two for the buildings to be erected on Grand River avenue and M A C.

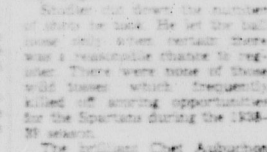
