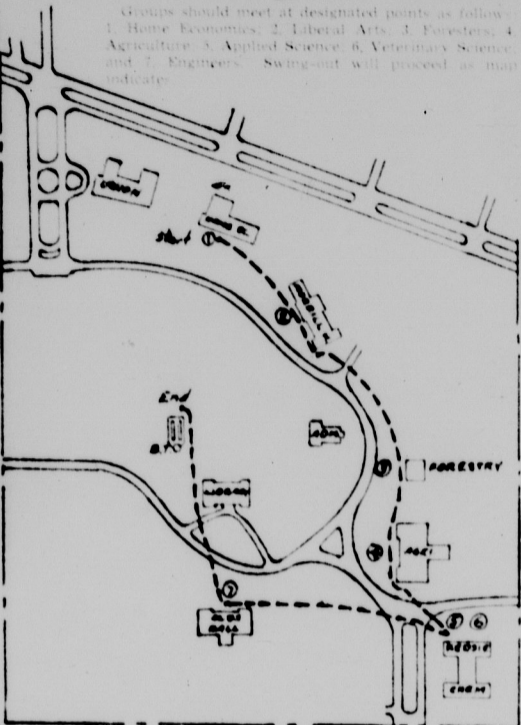

Negotiations Fail to End Local AFL Steel Workers' Strike

Call Monday Meeting In Hopes of Solving Labor Troubles

Labor turmoil again found its way into East Lansing Wednesday morning when the American Federation of Labor Steel Erectors Union called a strike at the new water plant construction project on the west side of the city.

Failure of negotiations, led by Duncan H. Campbell, department of labor conciliator, to solve the trouble at a meeting of government, union, and city officials at the city hall yesterday left East Lansing in a situation which has not been seen since the CIO-Michigan State college student battle in 1937.

First Dodge city engineers in charge of the project, stated that negotiations will be continued on Monday.

Trouble centers around the hiring of non-union workers by the Pittsburgh-Des Moines Steel company in charge of construction of a 200,000 gallon water storage tank and tower.

Union leaders claim the job, a PWA project, requires that only union men be hired. The project took the form of picketing and approximately six men now surround the site of the project displaying placards reading "Anti-Union".

Michigan State's baseball team is to maintain a winning average for the season that has thus far been better than any in the game's history, according to the members of the team who met in a session here this afternoon.

By directing a "7-1" decision of Michigan's National Wednesday, the Spartans brought their record for the season's first seven games won and six lost. "I don't know today, it will make their percentage an even 50."

Those games, starting before dawn on the 1939 schedule, were Tuesday's game at the University of Michigan, Wednesday's game at the University of Wisconsin, and the following Saturday's game at the University of Notre Dame.

Coach John Kille was expected to call on George Mankin to lead the team's batting line-up. Mankin was the only player to hit a home run in the game.

Michigan State will play host to next year's Central Collegiate Conference outdoor track meet, it was revealed in Milwaukee Thursday night.

The event, one of the nation's outstanding track meets, will bring to the State campus at least 10 leading third-level teams headed by Notre Dame, Marquette, Iowa, Indiana, Wisconsin and Texas.

State previously had been awarded the indoor Central Collegiate which comes off in Jenison field house in March.

Besides the two Central meets, the state indoor and outdoor meets and the National collegiate cross country meet also are booked for the local front.

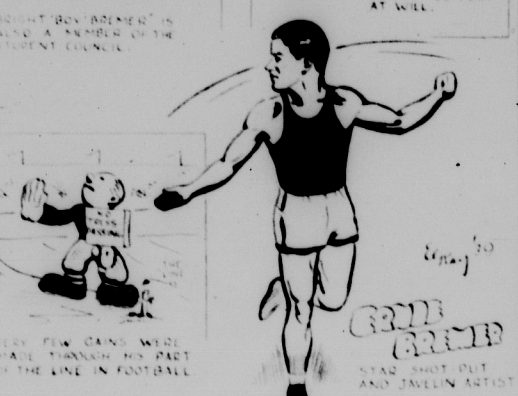
