As negotiations neared completion last night in the labor dispute over the new PWA water plant project on the west side of the city it appeared evident that the American Federation of Labor had won its fight to install union men in the construction of the new 200,000 gallon water tank and tower.

Difficulty arose Wednesday morning when the Pittsburgh-Louisiana Steamship company's construction of the water tank project was halted by the union men. The union men had a lock-out action with the Michigan Employment Bureau as a protest against the hiring of non-union men.
