

German Border Countries Strengthen All Defenses

Move Comes On Heels Of Assassination Try; Action at Slow Ebb

The Netherlands and other European lowland countries today had taken the most severe defense measures since the close of the last war following reports of mysterious incidents and Nazi troop concentrations along their German borders.

In the Netherlands, troops were guarding the newly flooded water line protection formed after dikes had been cut. The move was taken to cut off Rotterdam, Amsterdam, The Hague, and other industrial centers from a possible Nazi drive.

Belgium Digs In
In Belgium, maritime defenses along the Albert canal to the north had been strengthened. Belgian troops took over all main points from the border as far back as Liege. No evidence of extensive flooding was reported, however.
