Byrnes Flies To Paris For Peace Talks

Foreign Ministers Assemble To Break Big Four Deadlock

WASHINGTON, April 23 (AP)—Secretary of State Byrnes took off for the foreign ministers conference at Paris today on a peace mission so critical that he suggested to newsmen he was "standing in the need of prayer."

Byrnes was scheduled to arrive at Paris in 17½ hours—about noon Paris time—and meet with foreign ministers Molotov of Russia, Bevin of Britain and Bidault of France on Thursday.

PEACE AT STAKE

Beyond that, at least some of Byrnes' advisers think the unity of the great powers in penetrating the stalemate for if they cannot jointly work out peace treaties they may have to tackle the problem in some sort of separate basis.

Automatic Washer Solves Time Problem At Williams

BY NAY MORGAN

A potential blow to commercial laundry services, a possible setback in laundry milling production, and a decided asset to caddy mothers, may be the results of the newly installed Bendix automatic washing machines in Williams dormitory.

For 10 cents, the Bendix machines soak, wash, rinse, and dry nine pounds of laundry, exactly in a penny a pound. What Qavam said was interpreted by officials here as further strengthening their suspicions that his government was being under Russian pressure to apply for censorship to foreign correspondents.

To the extent that these latest developments in Iran reflect actual difficulties involving Qavam, they complicate Byrnes' task in Paris. The immediate objective of the Paris meeting is to break a deadlock over peace problems, but the real question is to determine whether some sort of understanding can be reached with Byrnes over the kind of world the Russians want to create out of the war.
