Byrnes Urges Reduction Of Austrian Occupation

## Molotov Disagrees With Plan

PARIS, May 1 (A) U. S. Secretary of State James F Byrnes urged the foreign ministers conference today reduce Allied occupation forces in Austria immediately and to plan simultaneous Allied evacuation of both Italy and Austria, a qualified co ference source reported.

Byrnes asked that occupation garrisons be limited pation garrisons be to 15,000 troops in each Austrian zone. and that their complete zone. And that their complete
evacuation later coincide with evacuation later coincide with
the withdrawal of troops from Ithly, this source said.

The proposals were made during a discussion of the Italian peace treaty. Byrnes said that so long as American troops remained in Austria, they would have to be maintained in Italy to pro tect supply lines. Soviet Foreign Minister Vya-
