Illini, UCLA Leaders In Comeback Roles

NEW YORK, Dec. 6 (AP)—Riding into the Rose Bowl as champs of two important conferences after finishing in the second division last year, UCLA and Illinois provide the most dramatic examples of improvement over their 1947 records in the long list of college football teams.

Arkansas, Kansas, Kentucky, North Carolina, Oklahoma and Richmond, among others, dispute the Bruins and Illini for the "most improved" team, but UCLA, all-winning last year, and Illinois, comeback after extra season defeats by Notre Dame and Indiana, rate close to the top.

On the other side of the ledger, the runners of Alabama, Oklahoma, Texas and Navy have slipped to their 1947 ratings, and the list of disappointments.

Brackonecke, Fields, Share 35 Years, Two-Wars Service

ROTC infantry instructors on campus include two men, Maj. Morgan A. Brackonecke and M. Sgt. Stirman H. Fields, who between them have participated in both world wars and have 35 years of active service.

in World War I, Sgt. Fields left the army for a year and rejoined the 6th infantry in 1920.

After eight years service he was assigned to the ROTC department at MSC. Except for time spent in army schools he has been on duty here ever since. He now has 27 years of active service.

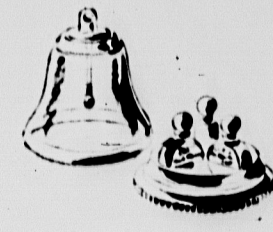

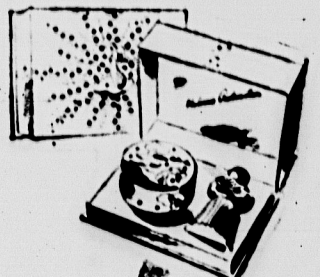

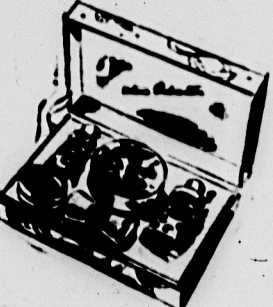
