ROBERTS' REPORTS:

China, Europe Recognize Need Of Self-Help Programs Before U.S. Aid Shipments

The United States, having learned its lesson in Greece and other spots, has been putting pressure for self-help ahead of American aid shipments to China as well as to Western Europe.

China's Premier, Chiang Kai-shek, last week that his government would fully recognize that, in order to receive the maximum benefit from external aid, it must first take measures of self-help.

This program should be the responsibility of the financial and economic matters of home state importance which will be handled by private industry.

'Ike' Bows Out As Army Chief; Says Russia Won't Start War

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP) - General Dwight D. Eisenhower declared today that no great nation, including Russia, would deliberately provoke a war at this time. At the same time he described the American Army as "carefully" seeking 100,000 more minimum requirements and called on everyone to become a volunteer.

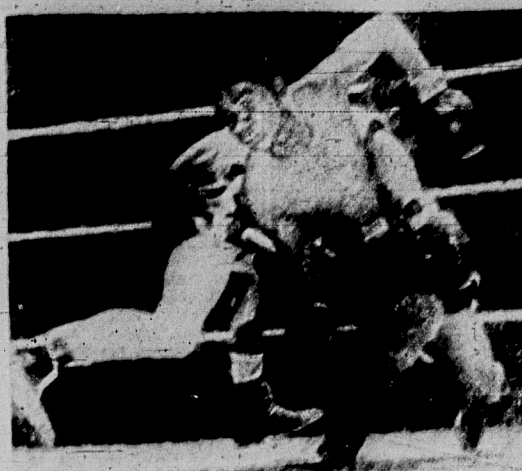

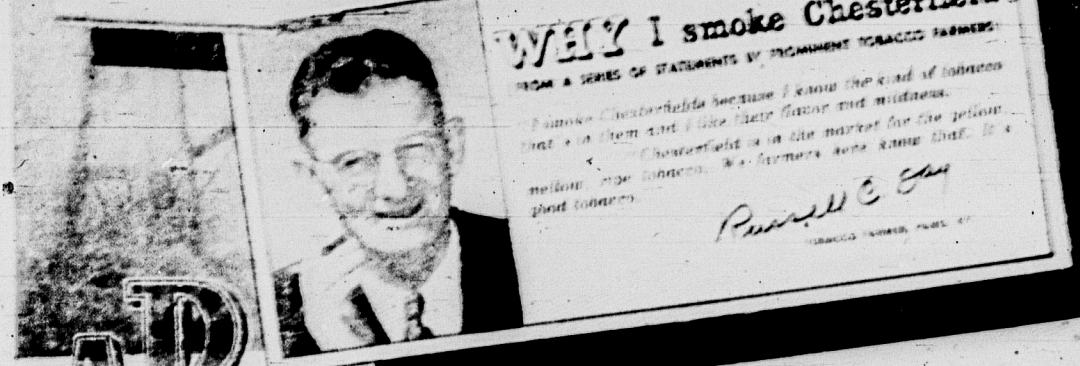

## Union Papers Test Legality Of Labor Bill

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP)

Two CIO officials today received court orders to appear Monday before a grand jury investigating alleged violations of the Taft-Hartley act's ban on union political spending.

The Justice department is reported investigating both CIO and AFL publications, circulated in recent congressional races. The unions contend the Taft-Hartley act bans violation of the freedom of the press and therefore is unconstitutional.

Attorneys for the AFL, CIO and United Mine Workers meanwhile disclosed requests to file briefs with the Indianapolis Federal court attacking another part of the Taft-Hartley act.

## Gas Starved Detroit Areas Promised Aid Immediately

(By the Associated Press)

Gas-starved Detroit, its industry closed by a natural gas shortage, was promised immediate relief today by Senator Homer Ferguson.

Ferguson said he had obtained assurances from top Washington officials that shipments of fuel oil to make artificial gas will be speeded to the Detroit area, where 200,000 workers have been idled for more than a week.

The cost of the shortage was estimated for the first time today in terms of auto production and dollars by the trade paper Automotive News.

The paper said the situation already has cost auto plants the output of more than 40,000 cars and trucks, and that 60,000 units would be lost when effects of closed supplier plants are felt.

The financial loss has been estimated at \$30,000,000 a week.

To relieve this situation, Ferguson said White House aid has been promised in untying a railroad snarl that has prevented the arrival of tank cars with fuel oil for the area.

He said John H. Neelands, assistant to President Truman, has pledged to take a hand, while the office of defense transportation made a definite commitment to fuel tank cars immediately.
