Musical Therapy Named Cure For Your Sleepless Nights

Music can aid in curing illness, cases of insomnia, orthopedic trouble, paralysis and the universal fear connected with the dentist.

A psychology senior in Abbot hall insists that the best way to sleep at night is when under the influence of soft music. He wakes up that way, too, and claims it's the only way to start the day.

But he may not realize just how many more uses music has.

"Music therapy, one of the most important uses of music, has been expanded by Professor Roy Underwood, director of music at Michigan State college.

Professor Underwood instituted a course in music therapy in 1943, which made MSC the pioneer school in this field.

Only MSC Offers Course

It involves the use of music in treating mentally deranged persons. Michigan State is the only college now offering this course, but the University of Kansas and University of Connecticut offer it next year.

One of the principles of this treatment is that it can soothe an abnormal person. It also may help a patient by letting him play a musical instrument which releases certain desires possibly suppressed for his entire life.

Some of the advantages of using music in hospitals are that it may help the timid person to overcome his inhibitions and if he participates in singing it will give the patient a sense of responsibility and co-operation.

An article called "Music in Institutions" said that in one mental hospital, a veritable epidemic of fights at mealtime was dispelled by cheerful dinner music at that hour.

Music Can Aid Sick

There are many other possible ways in which the proper use of music can aid the sick and mentally weak person. Most of them are learned when the students take such courses as Abnormal Psychology, Psychological Studies in Music and Sociology of Music.

Because of this, students taking the course at State must be skilled in psychology and sociology. They must be able to play one musical instrument and preferably two. They should like so-

cial work and be emotionally stable.

During the four year training period at State, students, selecting this major must take 11 terms, comprising 32 credits, of piano, six terms of sociology and six terms of psychology, and voice and theory courses in music.

Student Go To Eloise

At the end of both sophomore and junior years, the student spend one month at the Eloise mental hospital getting on the job experience. The last term of the senior year is also spent in internship at Eloise.

"The course in music therapy is a difficult one, and at the present time only 17 students are enrolled in it."

Professor Underwood said, however, that opportunities for persons able to complete the course are many, for there are over 600 mental hospitals in the country.

As he sees the field for music therapists widening, Underwood feels that "The art of music is now becoming a great humanitarian aid."
