Nine student delegates leave tomorrow for Columbus, O., to represent MSU at the three-day annual Legislative Conference on Public Affairs sponsored by the speech department of Ohio State university.

More than 30 colleges and universities will attend the convocation.

Functioning as a legislative assembly, students will divide into groups supporting left of center, center, and right of center views concerning the United States foreign policy towards the Soviet Union.

State Delegates

For Michigan State, Yearl Schwartz, Wendell junior, Robert Kuhlman, and Dorothy Sage, Detroit seniors, will support the "leftist party"; Richard Clausen, Lansing sophomore, Yvonne Weller and John Kenney, Flint and Detroit seniors, will argue for the "center"; while John Hamilton, Marshall junior, Zosma Hagen and Bernice Maroffite, Detroit and Lansing seniors, will sit on the "right."

Professor Bernard Knittel, State's director of forensics, will accompany the delegates and act as coach.

During the conference presiding officers will be elected, party caucuses will be held, and committees will form resolutions to present before general assemblies.

Sent To Capitol

"Party" members will debate the resolutions and decisions of the general assemblies will be sent to the national Congress in Washington.

The delegates will cover U.S. policies in the United Nations and occupation procedure in Germany, Japan, and Korea. Peace treaties and the Marshall plan will be reviewed and the exchange of students will be discussed.

Finnish Party Supports Pact With Russia

HELSINKI, March 20.—The powerful Social Democratic party accused Finnish Communists tonight of trying to provoke unrest in Finland.

The Social Democrats, one of the big three parties which constitute the government, in parliament, issued a statement urging the use of constitutional and democratic means in dealing with the question of a military pact with Russia.

Communist circles have shown their intention to use this situation for the purpose of national conflict and stirred among the classes, the statement said.

It also drafted a meeting of the party's parliamentary group to consider Prime Minister Stalin's request that Finland sign a defense and mutual assistance pact with Russia.
