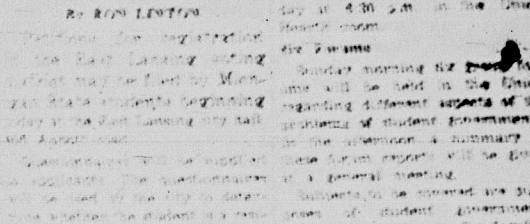

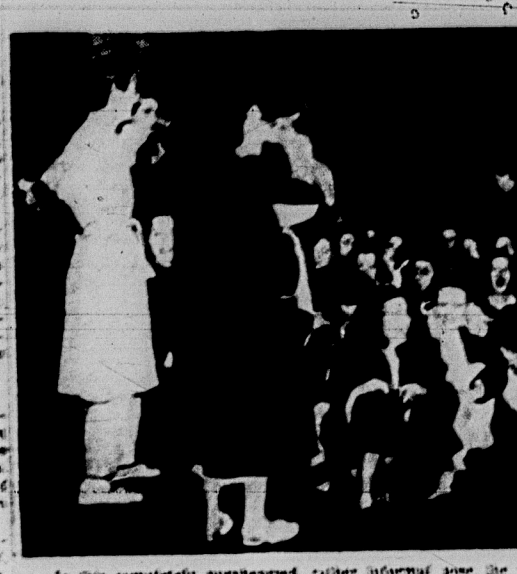

Too Crowded

AFTER DODGING PUNCHY PEOPLE who have been wandering about this campus for some time, it has come to our mind that maybe there was a little too much crammed into the nine weeks and two days of the past term.

Basketball, swimming, wrestling, boxing, term plays, foreign movies, the weekly parties, always a party, lecture-concert parties, snow, track relays, cold weather, farmers' week parties. All of which is natural to a normal term's activities, but winter term seems to be the catch-all for everything that ever happened at Michigan State.

And not that these activities are enough. The college expects the already beleaguered student to open books.

Not that we advocate no studying during winter term. By no means. In fact we are in complete accord with the educational theory that the professors should really throw the work to the students during winter term. Then neither spring fever nor convalescence from the summer stupor are operative.

BUT NINE STRAIGHT WEEKS (and two days) of social activities and term

papers is hardly good preparation for final exams, particularly when the whole business is started off with the completely frustrating experience of registration.

In view of all this we think there is an extremely simple solution—a week's vacation instead of midterm examinations.

And you may ask, "When the term is already so short, how will knocking off an other week help?"

The answer is obvious; it would give the bewildered student a chance to catch up on his sleep, his meals, or whatever he needs catching up on.

HERE WOULD BE A GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY to reorient, to re-gird one's loins and after the week of complete idleness is up (we hope that the student spends it as idly as possible), the regenerated student would be able to plunge headlong into the waiting activities and studies and push through to the end of the term without being driven into a state of complete confusion, as is the present case.

We think that such a plan would be highly valuable towards making a better school and higher standards and that it would automatically raise the all-college average to somewhere close to or above a 2.
