### Situation 'Threat' To World Peace

LAKE SUCCESS, May 17 (AP)—The United States and Russia joined today in a demand that the United Nations order the war stopped in Palestine.

### Russia Joins U.S.

Russia's Andrei A. Gromyko then jumped on the bandwagon with this statement to the council.

### U.S. Beats Russia

Gromyko made no direct comment on the terms of the American plan.

### Demand Cease-Fire Order

Austin demanded that the council vote an order to all governments and authorities to cease fighting and issue cease-fire and standstill orders to their forces within 36 hours after passage of the resolution.

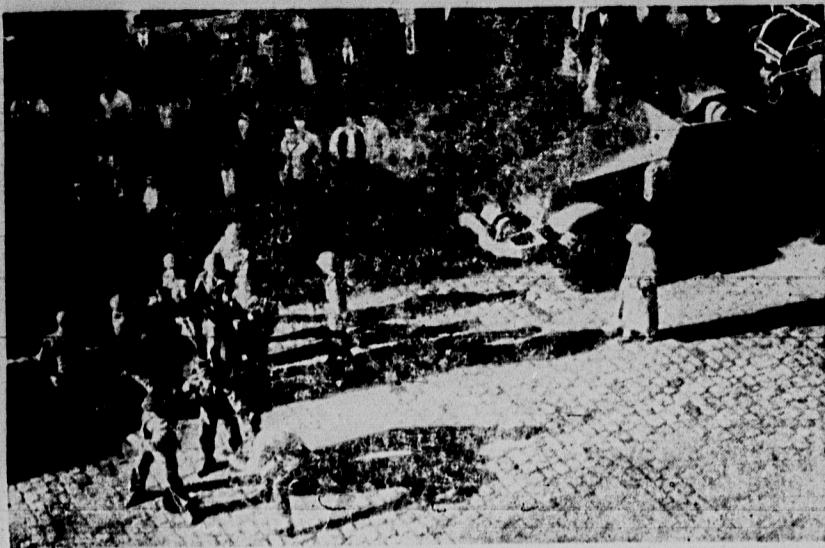

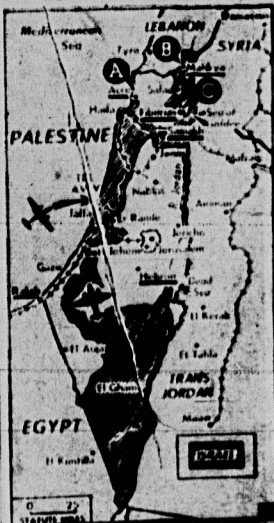
