Now this country is tending to forget that dramatic day of some 32 years ago simply because we're loaded with other military dates to remember. And they're all from

What veteran at Michigan State who forgot Armistice Day, will forget December 7th? Who doesn't know what V-J represents? D-day, when our troops pushed onto the beaches of Normandy, has a vivid meaning to MSC students as well as the rest of the nation.

The answer to these questions will strengthen the stu-dent government's hand to a degree never before experi-

The answers should also settle the question, of just
what organization is going to be the supreme student
government for all students. Possibly it would send the
government down-the road towards the structure and operation it has been seeking for many years.

A heavier budget would produce a larger program which in turn would interest more and more students depending on how the council used the money. In the latter statement lies the key. Is the council mature enough to establish a program that is useful and thereby make heir additional budget compensate for itself?

That is the risk everyone concerned has to take and it a worthwhile gamble.

naximum budget from the college — about \$1,200.

The additional money must come then from the initiative of the councilmen. They want to regulate properly the student organiza-

MANY OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS do not even meet,

many more meet but do nothing. Why should they be allowed to exist It should be a privilege to be in and have an organization on campus and if the organization can not prove its existance beneficial then it should be elim-

There is a method of eliminating these organizations that would be completely fair to the members and would not lend itself to a purging of organizations for selfish

That is a simple, registration fee for each term. The mechanics would have to be worked out on an equitable plan. For example the fee could not be levied by the number of members in an organization for some groups with few members are more active than those with large en-
