Via the Associated Press we get the news that the only.... television station owned and operated exclusively by an educational institution is working hard to cut down excessive profits

Reading about Iowa State college's WIO-TV brings to, mind that MSC is in the embryonic stage of establishing its own TV station.

The two stations are not as yet set up to parallel each other. In fact, right now they are exact opposites,

Whereas the ISC station has its own transmitter, but no control room where programs can be originated, MSC has the control room, but no license to transmit.

Iowa State stepped in at a ripe moment, and was assigned a television permit before the Federal Communications commission clamped a lid on applications for transmitters, nearly three years ago.

Today lowa State has a commercial arrangement with-four national TV networks, but they are working to de-velop their own special programs, in an effort to eliminate income-producing network programs.

It seems to us that lowans have the right angle — pro-duction of video broadcasts with educational purposes. This is just what WKAR-TV, or whatever the station

will be called, plans to do. But evidently they will be hampered until the FCC decides to lift their ban.

There are two steps that a prospective TV station must complete before it can broadcast. In the case of an

MSC station, the college must: 1. Make application to have a TV channel assigned to East Lansing. The college has applied for the transferal of a Grand Rapids channel to East Lansing, but it will be some time before a hearing comes up.

2. If a channel is assigned to the area, State can only wait until the FCC lifts its freeze before application can be made

Until then, MSC will have to be content with a campus hook-up, although programs could conceivably originate in the State control room, and be fed to WJIM-TV for transmittal.

It seems to us that the FCC is being'a trifle harsh in keeping its ban so broad, inasmuch as TV would be used for such a worthy program — education.

Two other colleges are in the same boat. Ohio State and the University of Illinois are now in the process of gaining the transferal of a channel to their respective areas. We can see plenty of reason for limiting the area of Milton Berle's influence, but we think the FCC could best further America's educational system by accepting applications for transmitters from the nation's colleges and universities

Great Discovery

In a talk with Gen. Douglas MacArthur the most striking and memorable thing I heard him say was this: "Man has at last made the great discovery; he has discovered how to destroy everything that he has created."

That remark came back to me when I read about Broth-erhood week which is promoted each year by the National Conference of Christians and Jews. There has always been reason enough for a feeling of brotherhood in the world. After all, the same old fabric of human nature reaches across all the borders of the earth. Those of us whe were born in America or those who have come to this country to make their home, owe more to luck and to chance than is usfally admitted. That I did not happen to be born in the most impenderable part of Africa or in a Siberian village or in Tibet or the less accessible part. of China is a mere matter of luck: It is nothing that I can properly boast of. It certainly wasn't because I was smart or thoughtful or farseeing. It just happened that my parents were who they were and that I was born where I was born

I hardly see how I or anybody else has any right or reason to look down on someone who did not happen to be so fortunate. The same thought applies to the hundreds of thousands who were born here in America and are in See GREAT, Page 5

College specialists concede that production of a TV program both useful and interesting is slow work, but as soon as each local program is ready it will be substituted for an income-pro-ducing commercial program.

ducing commercial program. Among prime m-wers in the WOI-TV undertaking are Dr. Charles E. Friley, ISC president, and Richard B. Hull, director of WOI. This is the situation as they outline it: At present—by a fortunate happenstance—WOI-TV is an educational low-budget station with a commercial cushion. That's because WOI-TV has one of the two lowa television permits granted by the FCC be-fore it clamped on the freeze which is still in effect. The oth-er lowa permit went to WOC-mer.

which is still in effect The oth-er lowa permit went to WOC-TV, a commercial station at Davenport. Even if it had possessed ex-lensive funds, WOI-TV could not even have begun to fill its time with worthy television pan-duction of its own when it start-ed telecasting a year ago. So the station signed contracts with four national TV networks, re-

four national TV networks, re-serving to WOI complete con-trol over program selection.
