WASHINGTON — (AP) — The air force today indefinitely suspended its plan to recall some 80,000 voluntary reserve officers and enlisted men to active duty.

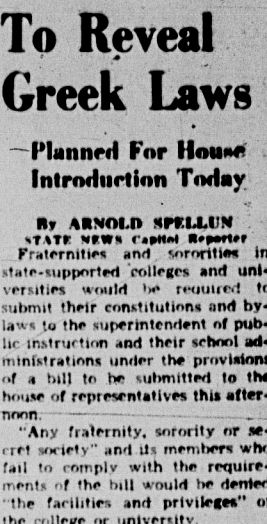
Draft May Hit 18½-Year-Olds
