

MSC to Host Delegates of College Union Convo

MSC will be the scene of the national convention of the Association of College Unions April 25 to 28. Approximately 400 delegates from 80 to 100 colleges are expected to attend and compare ideas on their unions and how they are run.

Tours of the campus will occupy most of Wednesday, followed by a 6 p.m. dinner at which Governor G. Mennen Williams will give the opening address.

Keynote Address

At 9 a.m. Thursday Dr. Harold C. Hand of the University of Illinois will give the keynote address. "What the Union Should Contribute Educationally to the National Defense."

Colleges and the Emergency will be the topic of higher education in the United States office of education in Washington, D.C., when he addresses the food and union directors Thursday afternoon at 2:30.

Food Directors

The food directors will also hear Carroll Chabin, general manager of the Coronade Restaurant company, at 3:30 Thursday.

At the dinner Thursday night Dr. C. L. Anspach, president of Central Michigan college of education, will give a speech to the entire group entitled, "And All of This." The Union board has also slated an open house for that evening.

Address to Students

Friday morning will open with

an address to the student faction of the convention by Dr. Howard McClusky of the University of Michigan. His speech will be entitled, "A Challenge to Student Problems."

Vice-president of the Rexall company, Fred Schmid, will speak to the food and union directors on "Three Steps to Food Service Success and How to Apply Them to Your Operation." Harold Sponberg of the MSC placement bureau will be the dinner speaker at the Friday evening meal.

MSC Talent

A show featuring MSC talent and the talent of the visiting delegates is also on the agenda for Friday night. Jean Sweeney, Glen Arbor junior, will give impersonations of various celebrities. Jim Mitchell, Grand Rapids junior, and Jim Strahle, Geneva, Ill., sophomore, will be featured in a piano and drum number.

Student chairman of the convention is Jim Gray of Oregon State college. Pat Fee, Highland Park senior, and Ward Ouradnik, Ann Arbor sophomore, are co-chairmen of the convention.

The four delegates representing MSC are Ward Ouradnik, president of the Union board; Bob Duxan, vice-president of the board; Kay Myers, secretary; and Barb Kusnel of the board of directors.
