The Spartan track team will attempt to cool off Michigan's red-hot Thinclads this afternoon in a Big Ten dual clash at Ann Arbor. Both teams are fresh from opening day victories. State beat Ohio State last Saturday 74-58 while the Wolverines put on an impressive scoring spree to swamp Wisconsin, 100-32. The Wolverines are rated heavy favorites to continue their winning streak. In the Badger rout, Michigan won everything except the 40 and one mile relay. **Tough Steedling** The Spartans will face heavy opposition in almost every event. This trio is considered the best hurdling corps in the country. In the broad jump, he will meet Horace Colman. Colman jumped 23 feet 6 inches in the Badger clash to win. **Meets McEwen** Capt. Warren Drazdler will meet the best distance runner in the nation in Don McEwen. It is not yet certain whether both will compete in the two mile, but McEwen is rated a strong favorite in the longer distance with Drazdler rated a chance in the mile. Bill Koural hopes as a top favorite to sweep both sprint events for Michigan. Bob Carey of Michigan is a little superior to Michigan's Bob Johnson in the shot.
