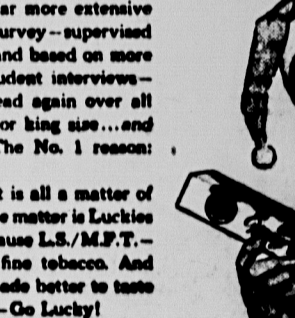

The annual conference for Michigan high school principals, Michigan State freshmen and junior college transfers is scheduled Wednesday morning in the Auditorium.

Approximately 216 students and 100 principals are expected to attend the meetings from 8 a.m. until noon, according to Ray Rider, student government head of high school co-operation.

The conference, which is being held on campus for the 17th time, is conducted by the office of high school co-operation with 50 Spartans serving as hosts.

A meeting of those signed up to work at the conference will be held in 26 Union today at 2 p.m. Anyone who cannot attend the meeting should report at his assigned time Wednesday, Rider said.

At the conference freshmen and transfer students will meet with their former principals to discuss problems in the transition from high school to college.

In Geneva, British and French officials said informally that all signs pointed to a Big Four session being held in West Berlin late in January.

Dulles' comment wound up testimony before a special House committee investigating Russia's seizure of the three Baltic states of Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia.

He gave advance notice that the United States will adopt a tough attitude in dealing with Russia's Foreign Minister Molotov in the event a satisfactory basis for a conference can be found.

His broad line, however, that the United States might agree to Russia's invitation to a conference rather sharply with official State Department comment on Moscow's bid last Friday. At that time, the department labeled Russia's note "disappointing" and said it represented neither Soviet move to block French approval of the proposed united European army.

itary Armistice commission, apparently to accuse the U.N.C. of "obstructing" the explanations.

There have been no Red explanations for more than two weeks, ostensibly for technical reasons.

Diplomatic talks aimed at arranging a Korean peace conference were in recess until Wednesday while the Allied side gave closer study to Monday's Red proposal which recommended New Delhi as the site.

Even before making more careful examination, U. S. Envoy Arthur Dean said the Red plan failed to "advance a single constructive idea" and he felt he could not recommend it to the United Nations.

The biggest argument stemming the five-week-old discussions in the role Russia would play. Monday's Red proposal still insisted Russia sit in as a "neutral" although the Communists did tend to agree with Dean that all neutrals should have no voting powers.

Dean has been insisting that Russia can attend only as a belligerent on the Communist side but Monday he advanced the suggestion that Russia might be a third party to the proceedings.

An Allied spokesman said the feeling was that once the talks got under way Russia would drift over to the Communist camp anyway.

Brownell Blasted by Democrats

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Democratic high command cut loose with a new blast at Atty. Gen. Brownell Monday night even as the Senate Judiciary Committee prepared to investigate charges that Brownell refused to provide FBI aid in a Denver jury-tampering case.

Clayton Fritchey, deputy chairman of the Democratic National Committee, fired a three-way barrage at Brownell in a radio broadcast accusing the attorney general of injecting the FBI into politics and "pulling it out of crime-busting."

Fritchey said he based his latest accusations on three published reports:

1. A federal judge's criticism of the Justice Department for refusing FBI help in the Denver jury-tampering case, which later was successfully prosecuted with the aid of Treasury agents.

2. A St. Louis federal judge's unanswered appeal to Brownell for more help from the Justice Department in a grand jury's investigation of labor union racketeering.

3. Statements by Republican Representatives Clare Hoffman of Michigan and Wini Smith of Kansas that "pressure" was exerted to halt a Congressional investigation of racketeering in Detroit.

Fritchey said he thinks FBI Chief J. Edgar Hoover was "distressed" at being brought into the sensational Harry Dexter White "spy" case as a witness before the Senate Internal Security subcommittee.

"The Democrats never once brought the FBI into partisan politics," Fritchey said, "but it was brought into politics on Nov. 17, before the Jenner Committee. We Democrats regret it and hope the FBI can be pulled back out of politics."

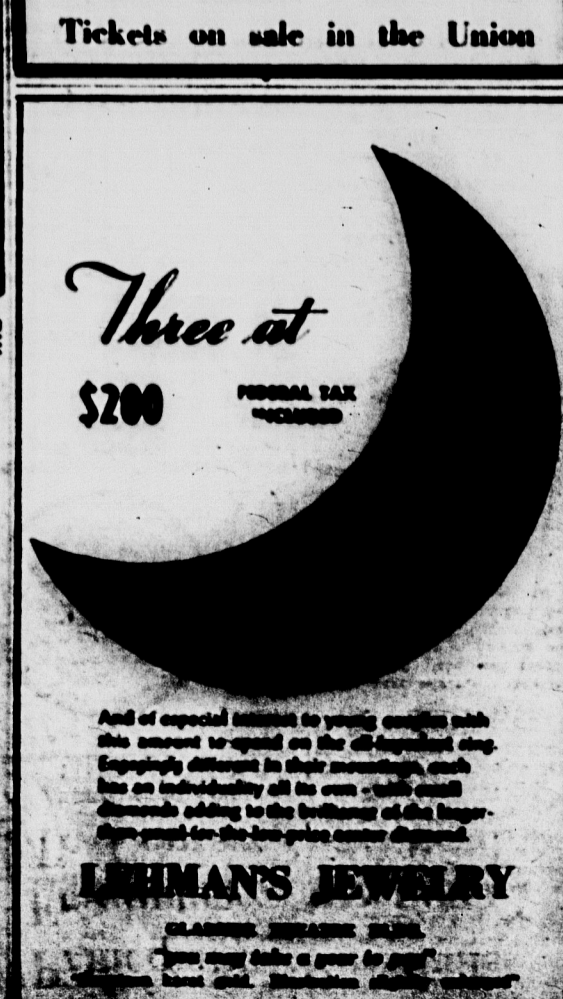
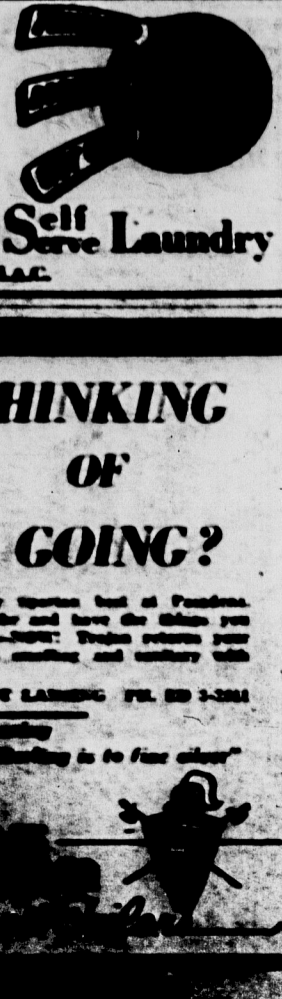
