Assistant Fire Chief Harol? Gauss said the fire expanently started in electrical wiring in the basement of the Campus Drug Store on the northwest corner of S State and E. Liberty. Flames destroyed the drug store and demolished half of a women's apparet shop, north of

Sweeping down E. Liberty St., the fire destroyed a youngsters'

clothing shop and ruined a cara-mel corn store before firemen brought the blaze under control.

Above the stores, the radac-ing salon and the Ann Arbor office of the Michican Learus for Planned Parenthood were destroyed. At least three shops suffered smoke and water dam-tro.

Thornton Announces **April Jaunt**

State Leaders **To Study Situation**

WASHINGTON (AP)-President Eisenhower, in a move believed unprecedent-ed, has asked a group of state governors to go to Korea ind appraise the situation there for the benefit of the American

Goy. Dan Thornton of Colorado, hairman of the Governors' Con-erence, announced in Denver hat he will lead a delegation to Korea about April 1.

Elsenhowers invitation was m-Exembowers invitation was ha-terpreted here as another move in his program to bring state executives into closer relation-ship to major national proh-lems. The White House already is cooperating in plans for a three-day meeting of the 45 nov-ernors here late in April to dis-ernor nere late in April to dis-ernor national security and oth-or prohlems.

White House Press Secretary James C. Hagerty said that so far as he knew this is the first time the federal government has init-the federal government has and ated an inspection trip abroad by representative group of gover-

The President wrote Thornton that he thought a short visit to Korea by a select group of gover-nors who are close to the American people would be "highly beneficial."

Thernian told reporters that to far four governors have ag-reed to make the trip with him. He listed them as Govt. Allan thivers of Texas, John Fine of Pennsylvania, Johnston Mur-ray of Oklahoma and Robert bers of the excettive commit-Kennon of Leuksiana, all mem-tee of the Governorn Confer-ence.

Other committee members Govs. William Bearsley of Iowa, James F. Byrnes of South Caro-lina, Frank J. Lausche of Ohio, John Lodge of Connecticut Lawrence Weatherby of ucky.

Editorially MSC, Abe Share Birthdays

Ninety-nine years ago today a college was born.

Forty-six years before, on the same day, a man destined to play a large part in the life of that college was born in Ken-

tucky. The college was MSC, the The concer was also, the the first school of agriculture and applied science in the Uni-ted States. The man was Abra-ham Lincoln, who in 1862 sign-ed the Morrill Act.

ed the Morrill Act. The Act, intraduced to Con-green by Sen. Justin S. Morrill of Vermont, donated to Teach state "public land to the amount of 30.000 acres for cach of the senators and re-presentatives in Congress. for the maintainence of a collecter where the leading object shall be to teach branches of learn-ing related to agriculture and mechanic arts, including mili-tary taclies." Encouragement for the con-struction of an agricultural col-

struction of an agricultural college in Michigan came in 1850, when the revised state constitu-tion provided that the Legisla-ture promote "intellectual scien-tific, and agricultural improve-ments"

Ments." After several years of public disinterest and a defeat in 1853, a bill providing for the estab-lishment of an agricultural col-lege was passed by the Legislaand approved on Feb. 12

International approved on Peter to 1855. Joseph R. Williams, a mem-ber of the 1856 constitutional convention and a piemeer champion of the Morrill Act, became the first president of the State Arrieutistral College. When the school was dedicat-ed in 1857, California was the only state west of the Missouri River: Grant was farming near St. Louis: Edison was a 10-year-old growing up in Port Huron, and the state of Michigan was only 20 years old. Six men, including Pres. Wil-liams, comprised the faculty.
