Hollyday's Resignation Accepted

Ike Orders Records Seized

WASHINGTON (P)-The administration cracked down on the Federal Housing Administration Monday, letting its boss resign but forecasting a number of dismisals and possibly some criminal prosecutions.

pome criminal prosecutions.

President Eisenhower accepted the resignation of FHA Commissioner Guy T. O. Hollyday. That announcement set off a round of disclosures of alleged "fleecing" of householders by home-repair crews and profiteering by apartment house momenters. ment house promoters.

But Hollyday's resignation was handed in, the White House said, to permit the Federal Bur-eau of Investigation and Holly-day's chief, Housing and Home Pinance Administrator Albert M. Cole, a free hand to investigate

Cole told reporters he considers Hollyday, 61-year-old former mortgage banker from Baltimore, a "good Christian gentleman." He may nevertheless be blamable, Cole said, because he apparently
"was aware of it—the alleged
prevalence of abuses—and did not

Eisenhower ordered FHA rec-ords seized and impounded by Cole. The latter announced the launching of a two-pronged inves-tigation—one inquiry into "irregu-larities" in FHA, another into possible criminal violations, to undertaken by the FBI.

The conduct of 14 top FHA The conduct of 14 top FIIA officials will be reviewed. Cole said, and a "number of the positions of senior operating officials will be affected." Asked whether this meant the men will lose their jobs, Cole said "yes," but added that not all would be affected.

Bass Bell Added to Beaumont Carillon

The first bass bell was installed in the tower Monday.
Only four more bells are needed to complete the MSC carilles.

However, William L. Davidson, director of the MSC Col-lege Fund, said that since carillonneurs consider four oc-taves necessary to render the fullest musical expression, the bell won't be heard until enough money is raised for the last three bells.

When the carillon is com-pleted, Davidson said, for the first time since Beaumont was built, students will be able to hear any type of song in any key.

The new bell, which was cast in England, will cost more to install than the other bells, Davidson said. Largest in the tower, it is five by five feet and weighs 3,582 lbs.

The bell is a gift from the parents of the MSC student body.

Editorially Coeds Revive Cigarette Issue

Late evening bridge games, and study or gab sessions in women's dorms are seldom held without someone smok-ing eigarettes. In fact, a spot check of 150 Mason Hall coeds picked at random revealed that 110 of the Mason Hall ke—either continually or occasionally. Whenever a coed needs cigarettes, she usually does

one of three things: 1. Buys them from an East Lansing store or the Union. 2. Borrows from her roommate, 3. Buys a pack from the girl across the hall.

MSC coeds have often asked for cigarette ver machines in women's dorms and recently have interested student government in the issue. By sending post-cards to a small portion of parents, student govern-ment found that 51 of the parents were unopposed to the machines, 44 were opposed, and 16 were un-

People favoring the vending machines have said they feel that the machines would be of great convenience to the coeds. They also point out that cigarette machines can be found in the men's dorms and ask why both groups

should not have the privilege.

The administration has maintained a policy against cigarette machines in coed dorms because a state law prohibits the sale of cigarettes to minors and it is felt there would be little chance for supervision of the machines in

.. However, there is no way of enforcing this rule in the men's dorms or the Union Building either, and the machines are not outlawed in these areas.

Perhaps this issue may encourage a discussion of the legal problems involved when minors smoke. A State Journal editorial states that if the smoking law is a good one it should be enforced. If it is not a good law and is impossible to be enforced, it should be repealed, according to the Journal, for "no law should be kept on the statute books that encourages disregard for laws in general."

One more reason for the administration's ban on coed cigarette machines has been parental disapproval, several of whom raised protests a few years ago after a cigarette company issued free samples in women's dorms

Therefore, it would seem that parental approval of the vending machines is a far more valuable criterion than student approval.

It is doubtful whether the State Board of Agriculture would authorize the installation of the machines unless a

majority of parents favor the move.

If students are interested in obtaining cigarette machines for coed dorms, it appears they'll have to request their parents to write to the administration approving the




Representatives from the dean of students office and the East Lansing merchants organization have also been invited. By this representation, CSF hopes to bring all points of view into the picture.




