## Terps Accept Bowl Selection

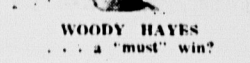

### Williams Tells Plans for Road Safety in State

Plans for a special highway safety program opening Dec. 1 were announced Tuesday by Gov. Williams.

The Governor asked Michigan motorists to begin to voluntarily observe the state's new speed law which does not become effective until Feb. 3.

"It is our hope," the Governor said, "that drivers will comply voluntarily with the new speed limits of 65 miles per hour by day and 55 by night so that they will become accustomed to the new law when it officially goes into effect on Feb. 3."

In a joint statement, Williams and Secy. of State James M. Hare proposed a campaign to save at least 200 of the more than 2,000 lives which they said otherwise would be lost during the remainder of 1955 and in 1956.

The Governor and Hare said they had been proclaimed "National Safe Driving Day" by the President. They proposed that instead of continuing the campaign for a month as in other states, that it run for 13 months.

Williams said details of a strict enforcement campaign will be outlined at meetings next week. State police, sheriffs and police chiefs will meet Nov. 24, judges and prosecuting attorneys, Nov. 25, and private and public safety organizations, Nov. 23.

### Land-Grant Institutions

## Brief Historical Facts Noted

Michigan State University, the pioneer land-grant university, this week is hosting approximately 900 delegates to the 66th annual meeting of the Association of Land-Grant Colleges and Universities.

Following are brief facts about the land-grant institutions.

There are 69 land-grant colleges and universities. They are in every state of the union and in Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. Seventeen southern states maintain two land-grant institutions, one for Negroes and one for whites. Massachusetts also has two land-grant institutions, the University

of Massachusetts and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. In 30 states plus the three territories, there is one institution each.

Land-Grant institutions take their name from the terms of the Morrill Act, passed in 1862. It created a perpetual endowment fund for each state with revenues raised from the sale of public land or land scrip granted the states by the federal government.

Sometimes regarded as primarily agricultural colleges, land-grant institutions produce graduates in other areas in far greater numbers.

For example, in 1953-54, land-grant institutions had enrolled, at both graduate and undergraduate levels, 69,420 engineers, 44,330 education students, 42,784 business and commerce majors, and 32,221 agriculture students.

Total enrollment in land-grant institutions in 1953-54 (the last officially reported year) was 396,000. It has increased sharply since the current estimate being 450,000.
