## **Totally Free Press Needs Cooperation**

COMMUNICATION IS MUCH in the spotlight now, Some think that it is all important and others think that it is being overemphasized. The level of communication is a vital factor in deciding the standard of living and the quick

progress of our society. We have developed the machinery with which to communicate but do we have the cooperation among men to make these machines effective? In the business world it is to the individual's gain to cooperate but in the field of government there is no such clear cut answer to the extent of communication that is the most valuable.

The communication problem here on campus has caused much debate. The protection of the individual student is the cause of the debate-how can this best be done?

The university policy maintains-when seen through the eyes of one who has to work with and through these poli-zies—that questionable material should be withheld. Questionable signifies the possibility of someone disagreeing with the ethics of the situation or of the school's publicity program being injured.

IF YOU COMPARE this university to a small city and the administration to the government of the city, the communications problem becomes simpler: Withholding of information in the small city has clearly been stamped bad by the framers of the U.S. Constitution and almost every city, town and village government.

It has been stamped bad because an informed public is the backbone of our country. An informed public can de cide on the justice of a situation. Publicity is one of the best ways of making government officials conform with society's expectations that has ever been devised.

Applying these principles to this university it becomes apparent that most forms of withholding information are definitely detrimental to the governmental progress of our

It seems as if the only time the student is truly well informed is when an incident arises where a large number of students are up in arms and wield the strong arm of publicity in off-campus newspapers. Then the best interests of justice are served. The recent tussle over student driving permits for cars that do not use the campus is an example

IF THE ONLY time there is a well informed and large group to decide on the justice of an issue is when it af-fects hundreds of students what happens to the individual

who is by himself? The student as much as anyone must have the right to question decisions in this university situation as he would in other places. Voltaire once said, "I disapprove with what

you say but I defend to the death your right to say it." A person must have the correct and full facts to make a fair decision and from then on Voltaire's statement so

well put comes into action. There is evidence that these policies in respect to the withholding of information stem directly from the highest administration echelons. It is time that these policies be changed and the rights of the student be given as much consideration as the ones dealt with by the Federal Commission on Civil Rights.
