# Chou Quits Post In Red Regime

HONG KONG (AP)—Chou En-Lai stepped down as Red China's Foreign Minister Tuesday and a close associate, Vice Premier Chen Yi, took his place. Chou remained as Premier with his high standing in the government apparently as firm as ever.

Peiping Radio said the change was recommended by Chou himself as part of a shakeup in government aimed at streamlining the Communist machinery for the start of the nation's second five-year plan.

Westerners here felt the move was to concentrate on industrial problems and to isolate Chou within the Communist party. At this stage, foreign trade will take a back seat to the task of making China an industrial power.

Chou, 60-year-old Chou, remains premier, has assumed leading in international affairs, but observers here feel he is still with the Red Chinese government that he abdicated to the foreign ministry post voluntarily.

The power in Communist China at present does not lie in foreign affairs but rather in internal control. By dropping foreign duties, Chou would seem to concentrate on that and build up his position within the party and government.

Red China now is launching its second five-year plan. The emphasis is on industrial development in the hope of putting China's millions to work at making the country one of the world's industrial powers.

There also is the possibility that Chou may have diverted some of his duties. Although there are no indications of major health deteriorations, at times appeared and was during his visit here and southeast Asia a year ago.

So there is the pool. Chen Yi, most active of Chou's vice premiers, is being touted as a successor to Chou as premier. His appointment as premier is a major problem.

But at the same time it will take him out of the sensitive foreign affairs where he is now free.

It appears at the moment that Chen is still playing a good part in show in Red China.

## On The Boards

### In Defense

RECENTLY A WELL known Detroit sports writer charged that Big 10 track suffered its "worst blow in 20 years" in Saturday's Michigan State Relays.

I do not intend to dispute this fact—only point out that Michigan State's failure to grab any first place honors was the result of a gamble.

In all fairness to journalistic truth and Coach Karl Schlademan I would like to point out some of the factors overlooked in the story charging the downgrading of Big 10 track.

I include Coach Schlademan—retiring this year after 13 years in his profession—because the performance of his team reflects its coaching.

The story pointed out that Big Eight schools won nine of the 17 events in which they were pitted against Big 10 teams: Michigan and Michigan State—perennially strong in track—both failed to win even one event.

Agreed. But it should be quite apparent to all critics that Coach Schlademan used both Capt. Dave Lean, Olympic silver medal winner, and Sophomore Willie Atterberry, holder of the world's record for the 600-yard dash, in the two-mile and university mile relay.

LEAN, WHO HAS run the 1000-yard run in 2:14.4 more than once early this year, could easily have beaten Wisconsin's Dan McKinney, who won the event in 2:19.5.

Badger Jesse Nixon, winner of the 600 with a 1:12.3 time, would have had his hands full if Atterberry, who set a world record of 1:08.5 at the Ohio Relays in 1957, had run against him.

Atterberry also held the fastest times in the 440 and the 880-yard dashes of any frosh or junior college athlete in the nation in 1957.

Incidentally, State placed second in the two-mile relay. Sophomore Herb Fisher, who placed fourth in the 300, looked very impressive, finishing second to Purdue's Roy Etherton in Saturday's preliminary heats.

Etherton, who won the preliminary heat in 2:13.3, went on to win in the finals posting a fast 2:11.0 time.

FORDY KENNEDY EARNED fourth out of a field of 15 runners in the mile run, behind Central Michigan's Ed Vanderheuvel who raced to a 4:16.6 clocking.


Hugh Enicks of Purdue copped second while a lone Big Eight entry placed third.

This article is not intended to be an alibi for Michigan State's track team or that of any Big 10 school—for neither one needs an alibi, each can stand on its own record past years.

Of the three records set in Saturday's meet, ALL THREE were set by schools from the immediate midwestern area and two by Big 10 schools.

Wisconsin's Jesse Nixon set a new meet record of 1:12 in the 600. Ohio State's Glenn Davis set a new meet and fieldhouse record of :08.9 in the 75-yard high hurdles. He also tied the meet record of :08.3 in the lows—and Michigan's Ed Hoyle set a new meet and field house record of 14.6% in the pole vault.

If this isn't enough to convince critics of their error thinking and still all voices of the ill-informed, then I only hope for the best—and expect the worst.

# Big 10 Cage Lead Shifts

First one team than another that's the way the Big 10 basketball leadership has changed.

Michigan, which is now in first place, was on top for the longest period—19 days. During this duration, the Spartans were idle because of mid-term exams and the other teams weren't able to take advantage of their fall.

But when Michigan returned to action it quickly gave up its sum so far, first place.

Michigan State's cagers were set in line to lead the closely-sundered teams. They held the lead exactly a week. A Spartan loss to Indiana and a Michigan victory over Illinois placed the halves back in the lead.

Monday night, however, gamblers stepped down as the predictor by losing to Minnesota, 80-69, and with State and Indiana winning they became secondary.

As the league's race begins to pick up its unpredictable pattern no team could win the championship.

The Spartans could break even deadlock with Indiana Saturday if they defeat Illinois because the Hoosiers are idle until Monday.

A primary factor in this year's race chase has been the home court.

Thus far, 42 conference games have been played, visiting clubs have been able to win but seven matches and Iowa is the only

team to boast two foreign court triumphs.

In the second half of the campaign if the home squads continue to win as consistently as they did in the first half the schedule favors State, Indiana and Purdue.

The Spartans and Hoosiers, co-jackets last year, are even in the number of home and road games left. Both have to play three before local fans and three away contests.

Purdue, (5-4), has three games at home and two away. Michigan, (4-3), has a definite

disadvantage by hosting three teams and playing four games abroad.




