Michigan State University, still stinging from a million dollar budget slash by the State Legislature last spring, formally decided Friday to seek \$45,707,292 for operation and construction in the fiscal year 1959-60.

No money was appropriated by the Legislature last spring specifically for Oakland, but MSU put \$30,000 aside from current general operation funds and used \$70,000 last year to begin activities there.

Application forms come off the presses this week.

Salary Increases Receive Priority In Budget Plans

The State Board of Agriculture put the strongest emphasis on salary increases Friday while approving a \$24 million budget for campus operations.

Philip May, board treasurer and MSU vice president for business and finance, explained that top priority in the proposed budget is for a 10 percent increase at minimum in the university's salary pool.

Among the Big 10 schools and California, MSU's average professor pay is No. 10, May explained. Associate and assistant professor pay averages are sixth from the top according to May

G. Mennen Williams, a supposedly well educated, well bred Princeton man, has rented the dignity of his office to




Perhaps our distinguished governor is making an attempt to have himself better known in the State of New Yeak for purposes of the presidential nomination, to which he purportedly aspires.

A public official he is, Not a Madison Avenue ad man, No matter how dignified the publication, the governorship of the State of Michigan should not be for rent.


