Blue Chips Set Record On Market

Institutional Cash Reason for Rise

NEW YORK, Nov. 10 (AP)—Blue chip issues scored big gains Monday as the stock market made another record high. The market performer was American Telephone, the most widely held stock and the favorite of small investors. AT&T led through the 300 level for the first time since 1948, rising to 300 1/2. This was the highest price since reaching 300 in 1941.

Just before the 1929 crash, "blue chips" rose to 310. The advance was accompanied by a similar rise in public opinion that the world would meet the 50-percent goal.

A new index of investment in new construction as well as the new housing program were given by the public as reasons for the rise.

The advance was accompanied by a rise in the steel industry, rising to a 1958 peak.

Lower decline in unemployment, rising auto output and expansion of another boom in new homes. At the same time, the steel industry which closed last week's election was followed by a rise in a new interest rate.

The rise was also reflected in a stronger bond market.

The board meetings of industrial and utility joint-stock companies, copiers, printers and building materials advanced. Rubbers and a new record.

Corporate bonds advanced in quiet trading.

U.S. government bonds were generally higher in quiet dealing over the counter.

The last previous top was \$19 1/2 in 1931. The year before that it hit \$17 1/2.

Hope Diamond Delivered To Smithsonian Institution

WASHINGTON (AP)—A mailman delivered the legendary Hope Diamond to the Smithsonian Institution Monday.

The fabulous stone, a gem of dark midnight blue, emerged from an ordinary looking brown parcel stamped "fragile" and tied with string.

It will be displayed in the hall of gems and minerals, the gift of a New York gem merchant, Harry Winston. He acquired the diamond, a stone of beauty and ill fortune, with other jewels for an estimated \$1.5 million dollars from the estate of Evelyn Walsh McLean nine years ago.

In presentation ceremonies, Mrs. Winston, a petite brunette in black and red and bedecked with pearls, said her husband hoped the diamond would become the nucleus of a national jewel collection.

Accepting it, Dr. Leonard Carmichael, secretary of the Smithsonian, said he hoped other great gems might be given to the institution.

The diamond, as large as a 50-cent piece, weighs 44 1/2 carats. It is the main piece in a specially built case inside the big steel safe behind several panes of glass at the Smithsonian.

A guard nearby warned the peering that too heavy a lean against the glass would set off special alarms.

Among those at the ceremony was Postmaster General Arthur E. Summerfield. He said he was glad the U. S. mails had a part in getting the gem to Washington from New York.
