by the enthusiasm of the GI, who had taken part in the bombing of

the passage from the Gospel of
Luke telling of the crucifixion of Christ and how he forgave Fuchida barely missed the retaliation of the U.S in 1945. He
was in Hiroshima the day before an American atomic bomb near
