Wrestling Picture Improving

Grady Peninger, the Spartan wrestling coach, has a optimistic outlook on the teams chances for a successful Big 10 season.

The Spartans had a disappointing eighth place finish last year, due largely to injury problems.

State should definitely improve this season, because of the many returning lettermen and a promising group of sophomores, according to Peninger.

The returning lettermen include Gary Smith at 123 pounds,

Tom Mulder 137, Monty Byington 147, Hap Fry 157, Robert Archer 167, and Homer McClure at heavyweight. Fry placed third in the Big Ten meet last year.

The Spartans received a bad blow when they learned that Cecil Holmes will be out for the season because of an operation. This leaves a gap at 130, but two promising sophomores, Don Daminac and Fred Anngeres, will fight it out for the vacated position. Terry Leonard at 167

is a former junior college wrestling champ. Leonard, a sophomore, figures prominently in coach Peninger's lineup. The other sophomore hopefuls are Richard Cook 137, Dick Turnberll 147 and Bob Hansen 157.

Michigan State has a rugged schedule for the 1963-64 season. They have matches with Oklahoma, last year's NCAA champs, and Pittsburg, who finished third in the nationals. State faces seven Big Ten opponents, including Michigan whom they meet at home on February 22. The Big 10 tournament is being held at Madison, Wis. on March 6 and 7 this season.

Peninger said that Michigan has one of its best teams in their history, but believes that State could battle it out with the Wolverines for the conference crown "barring the unpredicted." All in all, Peninger predicts a fine season for 'S' wrestling fans.

Megaphone To Winner

The winner of the State-Notre Dame game will gain possession of the Megaphone Trophy (see cover).

The trophy, presented for the first time in 1949, is given to the winning team by the Michigan State and Notre Dame Alumni Clubs of Detroit.

The large megaphone, one half of which is blue with a gold ND monogram, and the other half white with a green MSU, has all the scores of previous

games between the two schools inscribed on it.

Notre Dame has only held the trophy twice. First, in 1949 when they topped State 34-21, and for the second time in 1954 when they won 20-19.

MSU has had the trophy in its possession since 1955 when they defeated the Irish by a 21-7 score. Last year they retained their hold on it by downing the Blue and Gold 31-7.

ND-MSU Game Part Of Great Tradition

What's in a name?

There's plenty if the name happens to be "Notre Dame" and the sport is football.

True, the Irish have a losing 23-2 record over the last five years, and the days of glory may be gone forever.

But no one ever takes lightly a school whose name was once synonymous with college football.

It's always a sign of prestige to win against Notre Dame, but it's also a certainty that the Irish will be in the contest from start to finish.

The Spartans will take these thoughts into tomorrow's 2 p.m. game at Spartan Stadium.

Notre Dame has been unable to defeat MSU in the last seven outings between the schools. In fact, the Irish have won only one of the past 11 Spartan games and haven't registered a triumph in Spartan Stadium since 1949.

The conditions seem right for an upset tomorrow afternoon, but for a Spartan team to let up against Notre Dame is unheard of.

The Spartans will be trying to keep the momentum of a four-game winning streak, while the Irish will be attempting to throw off the doledrums of a three-game losing skein.

TV Game Doesn't Stop Radio

Saturday's game may be on television, but it certainly isn't discouraging the radio stations from broadcasting it.

Over 35 Michigan stations will carry the game, along with the ABC network in Chicago. Only nine stations will actually have representatives in the radio booths at Spartan Stadium. The rest will get the game off one of the other station's lines.

WKAR will originate the broadcast for a total of 26 stations around the state. WJR, Detroit, will feed the game to three stations, while six stations will broadcast the game only for their own listening areas.

WLS and WJIM carry the State game in Lansing. WBRB, WWBC, WIBM, and WOWO are the other one-station originators. Red Barber and Johnny Lujack will handle the play-by-play and color.

Because of the televising of the contest, game time has been changed to 2 p.m. Spartan games usually begin at 1:30 p.m.

Irish Series Dates To 1897

The series with Notre Dame goes back to 1897, when the Irish defeated Michigan Agricultural College, 34-6. MAC didn't win a game with the Blue and Gold until 1910 when they posted a 17-0 shutout.

In the first 16 meetings between the schools Notre Dame won 14 times, blanking the Green and White in 12 of those games.

In a sense, the Spartans owe their football life to Notre Dame.

Many experts feel that MSU's 35-0 "upset" of the Irish in 1951 was the turning point in Spartan grid history. It showed fans all over the nation that the East Lansing school was, indeed, a national power and had to be considered as such from that time on.

Then there was the 21-3 victory in 1952 which removed the last major obstacle in the Spartans' road to a national championship.

The only Notre Dame win over MSU since 1949 was posted on a rainy afternoon in 1954 at South Bend.

The Irish lost only one game that year and the Spartans won only three in Duffy Daugherty's first season as head coach.

The Green and White went into the game as 13-point underdogs but only lost by a 20-19 score. A

miss on a point-after-touchdown attempt in the last minute kept the Spartans from earning a tie.

Since that time, MSU has outscored Notre Dame 191-40 in seven contests.

The closest the Irish have come to stopping the Spartans since '54 was in 1961 when the score was 17-7 and the teams went into the contest ranked 1-2 in the national polls.

Past records won't mean a thing when the squads get together tomorrow afternoon.

MSU will go into the game as a two touchdown favorite, with some fans expecting a letdown.

On the other hand, the Irish showed few signs of brilliance in recent weeks, and it could be safe to assume that this week will be no exception.

Either one of these cases would be true---if one team wasn't MSU and the other Notre Dame.

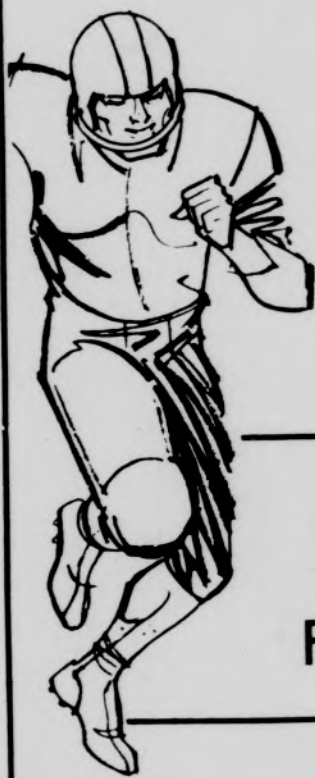

Versatility and durability are the twin keys to greatness for Sherman Lewis, State's brilliant 152-pound left halfback.

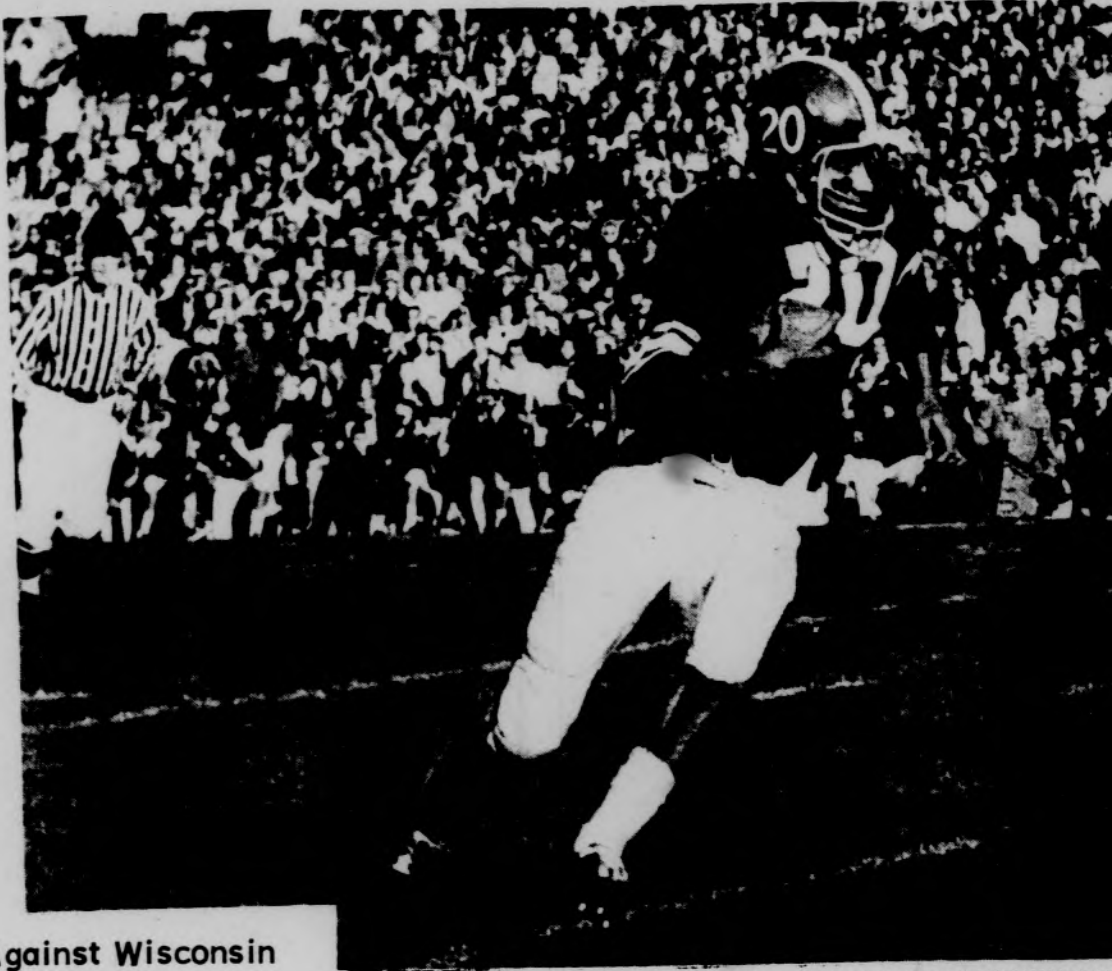
With them he is opening the doors to gridiron immortality as one of the great little men of the game's history, along with such as Albie Booth, Davey O'Brien, Eddie LeBaron and Cotton Warburton.

During his career at MSU the Louisville senior has come to be regarded as one of the most dangerous breakaway runners in the game. He's also a dependable third and two man, an accomplished receiver, a skilled defensive halfback, and even a passing threat.

Sherm has shattered enemy nerves by every conceivable method except kicking. But don't count him out there either. He still has a couple of games to go.

As to endurance, he never has missed a game in three years because of injury despite the fearful pounding he takes.

Lewis with 21 touchdowns is the highest scorer for State since the Spartans entered the BIG Ten. He has the record for the longest run from scrimmage by a Spartan in Big Ten play (87 yards) and was on the receiving end of the longest touchdown pass in MSU history (88 yards).

Anderson Hopes For A Winner

Basketball Coach Forddy Anderson will be looking for his first winning season in five years when his team opens against Northern Michigan on Nov. 30.

Last season the Green and White's record was a dismal 6-17, which includes two wins and a loss to service teams in Hawaii over the holiday period.

Anderson's 1958-59 club grabbed MSU's first undisputed Big Ten title, winning more games than any other State squad. They were ranked third nationally by the wire services and helped set a season attendance record of 103,504 fans at Jenison Field-house.

Anderson came to State in 1954 and in 9 seasons his teams has compiled a 108-97 record.

Penn State, Ohio State, Iowa and UCLA will face the Spartans in football in 1965.

State last won the Big Ten in 1956, while California won the Big Ten Day in 1958. The Spartans also got a Rose

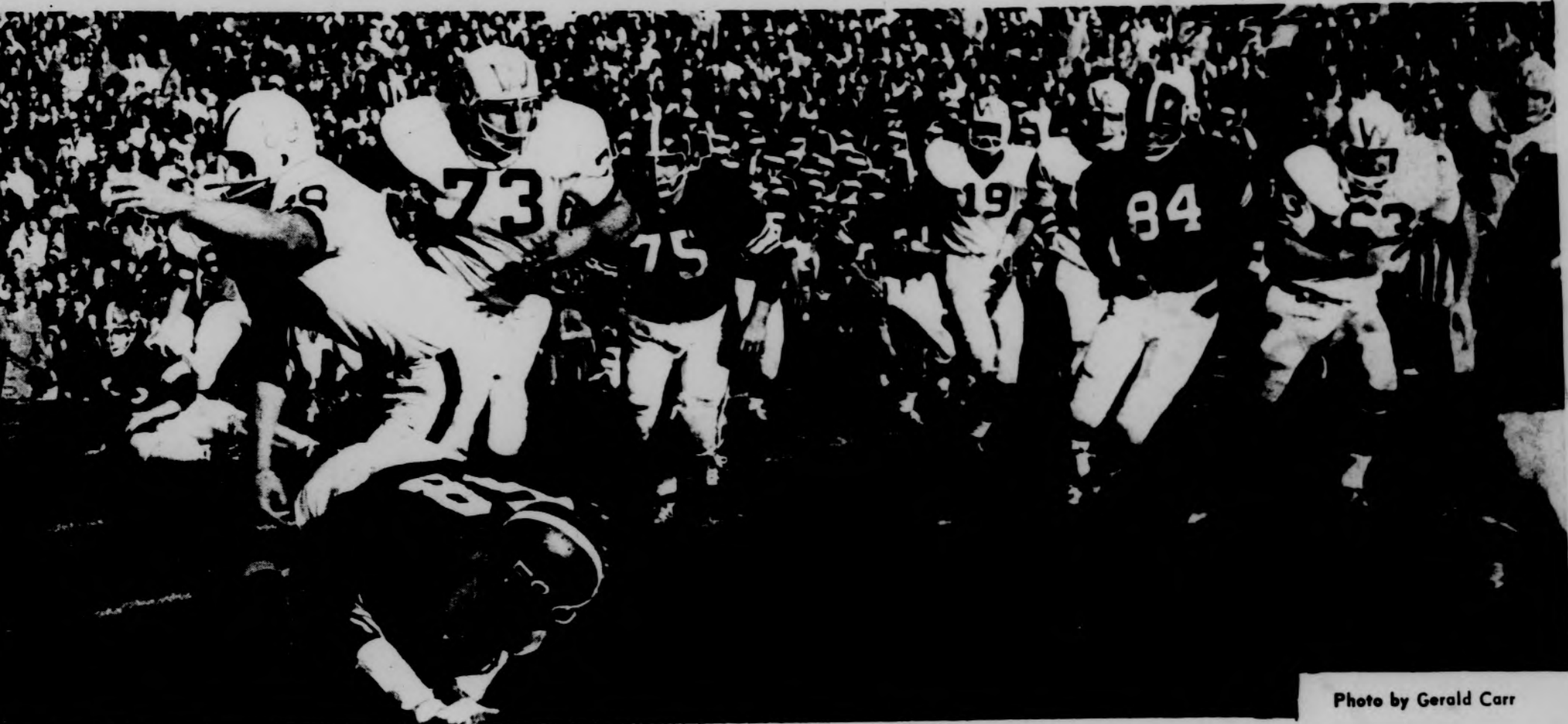

Harriers Strive For Title

Cross country pilot Fran Dittrich, not one to tamper with success, will employ the same seven-man squad that carried off last week's Big Ten trophy, when his hopeful harriers invade New York City this weekend to take part in the 56th annual IC4A championship at noon on Monday.

The Spartans, who finished a close second behind Villanova's Wildcats last year, will be trying to move up a rung to first place this time out.

To gain their way to the top spot the Spartans will have to pass a trio of formidable foes, that have been dubbed title con-

tenders along with State. This group includes defending champion Villanova, Ivy Leaguer Cornell, and unbeaten midwestern independent Notre Dame.

Villanova, a year-in and year-out scourge in the east, claims primarily the same cast that edged State 49-53 in the tourney last season.

The Wildcats only missing link from last year's fine team is Pat Traynor, who placed second in the IC4A triumph. The return of the other four point getters has easily taken up the slack left by Traynor. The Wildcats also possess one of the outstanding runners in the nation in Vic Zwolak.

Zwolak captured the individual title on the five mile course at

Van Cortlandt Park last season in record setting time of 24:47.2. and probably will be the pace-setter again. Two other outstanding Wildcat harriers are Dave Hyland and Tom Sullivan, both of whom finished high in last season's IC4A running. Villanova will be fresh from a 19-41 pasting of arch-rival LaSalle last week, the climax to an unbeaten campaign.

Despite the presence of one of the top title threats in Steve Machooka, Cornell's title pich will depend on the showing of a talented crop of sophomores. Machooka a native of Kenya, Africa, won the IC4A individual title two years ago, but sat out cross country last year due to scholastic ineligibility. The fleet senior lost no speed during the layoff though, since he hasn't been beaten yet this season.

The key to Notre Dame's unblemished slate this season has been team balance. Included in the Irish victory binge was a powerful win over State, when they grabbed five of the first six positions. The Irish, however, have found flat courses like their home course to their liking and may have trouble with the hilly Van Cortland layout.

Pacing Notre Dame's attack this season has been senior Frank Carver and junior Bill Clark. Both finished in the top ten of the IC4A tourney last year, and are expected to be among the top finishers once again.

Spartan fortunes also lie with team balance. If State can come up with another team effort like the one that paved the way to the Big Ten title last week, they will be right in the thick of the team race.

The brunt of State's Big Ten success was carried by sophomores Dick Sharkey, Rick Zemper and Paul McCollam. Coach Dittrich will be counting on good performances from Captain Bob Fulcher, Jan Bowen and Mike Kaines, all of whom won places in the IC 4A for the Spartans last season.

The second team, on the strength of two wins last weekend, now sports a better than average 3-1-1 mark. They'll al-

so be in action at Eastern on Tuesday.

Kay Stoney moved into a tie with Nancy Dash for the first team scoring lead last weekend. Both have four goals to their credit.

Pacing the second team have been Kathy Collins, whose three goals dumped Kalamazoo College last Saturday, Linda Centolella and Jill Thomas.

Coach Dorothy McKnight felt the hockeyettes displayed their best team effort of the season when they defeated Western Michigan last week. She hopes they'll keep on improving when they meet Eastern.

Handicapped Learn To Swim

Handicapped adults and children are gaining a feeling of mobility in the water as a result of the work of a group of MSU juniors and the American Red Cross. Every Saturday morning between the hours of 9 and 11:30

the handicapped "students" are brought to the Women's IM Building Pool to take part in the class.

The program has been in effect three years. This year, Evan Thompson and Mrs. Harriet Young are the Red Cross instructors who are aided by juniors majoring in Physical Education. As part of their teaching experience the Phys. Ed. majors work with the handicapped, whose ages range from five to forty.

The students are taught to float and propel themselves in the water by using specially designed equipment. Thompson devises much of the teaching tools himself and Dow Chemical Company foots the bill.

Deaf and blind students are taught, as well as those afflicted by cerebral palsy, polio and muscular dystrophy. Those who are unable to use their legs or arms are taught to use their bodies in swimming. This develops body tone and improves their movements.

Those with the ability are taught to dive, as well as swim.

Thompson hopes that the class will become a training ground for swimming teachers of the handicapped and that many more instructors who are interested in water safety will participate.

All those coming to tomorrow's contest are reminded that game time is 2 p.m. The regional telecasting of the game is the reason for the half-hour starting delay. Next week's game with Illinois will start at 1:30 p.m.
