## Goldwater Seen

 In Another Light| fully slow progress toward a social consciousness'". <br> Calling Goldwater a "militarist" shows a failure to be aware of the school of thought to which he is entitled to belong. Whether we agree with Goldwater's belief in a constructive, positive and non-appeasement type of foreign policy is irrelevant. The importance is that we know what his belief really is. The fact is that he believes we should stop the spread of Communism not only through meeting their threat with our counter-threat, and meeting their force with our resistance, but also by taking the offensive at times and forcing them to react to the U. S. instead of vice versa. Senator Goldwater believes that this sort of action will be a deterrent to nuclear war and not lead to it. <br> Similarly, the accusation that Goldwater is a "nationalist" can easily be dispensed with. (It is my assumption that Mr. Shea attempted to use it in a derogatory sense, although the term itself does not necessarily connote evil.) Senator Goldwaters is a "nationalist" in the respect that we want all United States poliGoldwater might have received this label because he is not an ardent advocate of the United Nations. <br> However contrary to what some journalists would lead us to believe, he does NOT WANT TO WITHDRAW FROM THE UNITED NATIONS. However, he belleves that the efforts of the U.N, are limited because every nation is in it, including the Communist nations. Sen- ator Goldwater believes that as long as the Soviet Union and other nations refuse to pay their share of the expenses of the United Na tions that they do not truly desire peace. <br> He argues that the North Atlantic Treaty Organization can be a much more effective instrument for the realization of world peace. <br> Lastly we must say something of Senator Goldwater being the "protector of the wealthy class." There are innumerable refutations to this statement, but let us use only one. <br> Senator Goldwater has continually fought the increase in the Federal budget. Crossing party lines on April 8, 1957, in the United States Senater Goldwater committed what appeared to be political suicide when he chastised President Eisenhower's record $\$ 71.8$ billion budget. <br> President Eisenhower was responsible for the election of Barry Goldwater to the Senate in 1952. Still, he had the conviction of principles to stand up for the American taxpayer, regardless of monetary stratification. Does not a reduced federal budget help all Americans? Goldwater has also called for a reduction in the progressive income tax. <br> HE HAS NEVER ADVOCATED THE ABOLISHMENT OF INCOME TAXES as some journalists purport. Would not a tax cut help the poor class also? Would not a tax cut at the right time create more money? Would not more money help the poor man also? |  |
