multitude of reasons, not the least of which multitude of reasons, not the least of which
are teaching and trying to pursue their
own education while teaching others. own education while teaching others.
Both faculty and students feel that Both faculty and students feel that they
must have a great deal of freedom to
pursue their goals.
Running the university
The administration on the other hand is
charged with the general well-being of the
University. In practice this means running University. In practice this means running
an efficient bureaucracy, and the MSU adan efficient bureaucracy, and the MSU ad-
ministration does this with amazing skill, considering that they have to put up with free thinking students and ira scible faculty
members. members.
The administration views with alarm anything which may upset the status quo of the system it has constructed.
When the exercise of the freedom which students and faculty consider necessary students and faculty consider necessary
threatens the status quo, a aenuine conflict
develops, for the administration has no
administration as a bunch of ogres who
arbitrarily set out to squelch individual

When individual freedom runs afoul of smooth operation of the bureaucracy, in-
dividual freedom must go unless it has dividual freedom must go unless it has
powerful support outside the administra${ }_{\text {tion. }}^{\text {po }}$. and students will claim that the adminisand students will claim that the adminis-
tration does have a vested interest in individual freedom. Only by allowing free
exchange of ideas can the university frew exchange of ideas can the university grow
in academic stature. But this only applies to academic freedom, and the administration apparently rejects this view, even as it applies to academic freedom. posed to each other in at least some areas. It would be naive to expect the adminis-
tration to relinquish tration to relinquish some or all of its
power voluntarily; this sort of thing simply power voluntarily; this sort of thing simply
isn't done, in the university or anywhere else: those who have power try to keep it.
