Education master plan at mercy of masters

James O'Neil, winners in of Education. are Board tremendous task.
Responding
tion questioning, both cited the need for a master plan for Michigan's higher education and stated their intention to see that such a plan
is drawn up.
Their comments were based on the premise that a plan would help reduce the needless duplication in the state's administration of higher education. A plan would streamline such efforts.
Such a plan is a noble idea, but one that will meet with little success in Michigan. The State Board of Education, simply, has virtually no power to carry out such a plan.
According to the Michigan Constitution, the State Board is to plan and coordinate higher education. The itsen stitution contradicts itself, however, by saying the board is not to exercise supervision or leadership over higher education.
What, then, is the State Board's role? This has been the burning question since ratification of the constitu-
tion. It is yet to be an-

## swered.

But one thing is clear. The State Board may draw up all education that it wants to It won't really matter. As It won't really matter. As
long as the legislature and
universities agree with the
State Board, the Board's master plan will be followed. But, the minute either disagree, the master plan will be shelved and the State Board forgotten. Since the State Board's powers are constitutionally ambiguous, the Board will have no recourse.
The idea of a master plan has merit, but we can't get excited over it. The legislature is not about to relinquish any of its financial powers. And neither of the parties will stand for any roadblock they can get around.

Students claim that it is their dollars which keep East Lansing solvent and that the merchants show their thank by jacking up prices.
ASMSU is undertaking two projects to relieve this ir itation.
The first is a study of the omparative prices of Eas tansing and other towns of comparable size.
This is an important first step. Any program to lower prices must have a factual asis from which to build
While we suspect that the prices in East Lansing are unusually high, the survey will provide figures to either upport or destroy guesse of this type.
The other ASMSU proposal promises more immediate relief for the students. It is negotiating with East Lansng merchants and Varsity International Sales Association, an outside agency, to tart a student discountsys-

The discount system would lower prices in selected stores to students with special coupons.
