

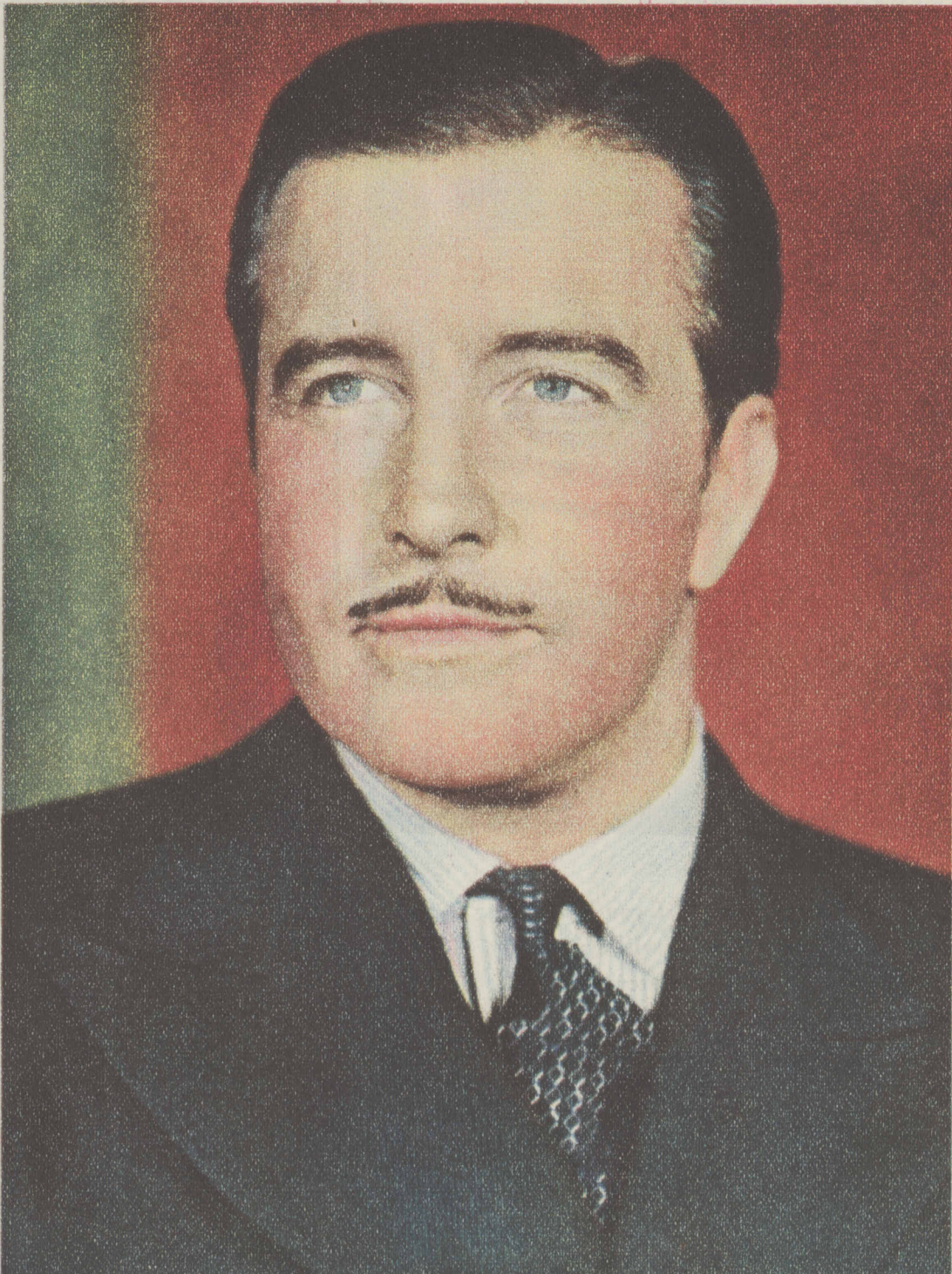
HOLLYWOOD HEADLINERS
