### Emma Boynet, Noted Pianist, Plays Tuesday

A newcomer will open the Adult Education council's Musical Arts Piano series in Orchestra hall on Tues. day night. She is Emma Boynet, said by some to be the foremost French woman pianist of today. Parisian born, she received the major portion of her artistic training under Isadon Philipp. Six years ago she made her American debut with the Boston Symphony orchestra, but this is her first appearance in the midwest. Being a reputedly distinguished exponent of modern French music she has chosen to play two groups of works by Fauré, de Severac, Ravel, Debussy, Ibert, Philipp, and Chabrier. Prior to that she will devote her abilities to a Mozart sonata and numbers by Brahms and Chopin.

The indefatigable Russian Trio will begin its series of half dozen morning recitals in

ten for their combination of instruments. On the inaugural concert are listed the Brahms C minor and Arensky Trios. Later in the season, the first local performances of three works will be given: the Bach-Otterström Trio transcribed from the cello and piano sonata in G minor, the Wolf-Ferrari Trio in F sharp, and Enrico Bossi's Trio in D minor. The members of the Russian Trio are Nina Mesirow-Minchin, pianist and director; Herman Felber, violinist, and Ennio Bolognini, cellist.

David Van Vactor, young Evanston composer and flutist with the Chicago Symphony orchestra, will journey to Cleveland this week to conduct that city's symphony orchestra in pec formances of his Symphony in D, which last year won the New York Philharmonic - Symphony prize of \$1,000. Thursday and Saturday are the days of the performances.

In Curtiss hall on Monday afternoon the Musicians' Club of Women will hold another of its concerts. The program will begin at 2:30 o'clock, d the participating performers will be Esther Schultz Ehrhardt, Alma Wallace Randall, Charlene Dilling Brewer, Virginia Auyer, Millicent Chapman Cooke, Natalie Parker, and Ruth Klauber.

William Hughes will conduct the Central Church chorus this morning in Orchestra hall in anthems by Protheroe, Otis, and Gaul. Bach and Sturges are the composers represented on Archer Lambuth's list of organ numbers for the service.

The New York Symphony society, one of the two organizations that merged to form the present New York Philharmonic-Symphony orchestra, is of about the same vintage as the Children's Memorial hospital of Chicago. It is this latter institution which will present the New York ensemble at the Auditorium theater on Sunday, Nov. 26, for its first public benefit. The Symphony society had its inception in 1878, while six years later the hospital was founded, being known at that time as the Maurice Porter Memorial Hospital for Children. Incidentally, the orchestra will offer the Chicago première of Weinberger's Variations and Fugue on "Under the Spreading Chestnut Tree," a work dedicated to it and its conductor, John Barbirolli.

On Dec. 3 the Civic orchestra of Aurora will inaugurate its twenty-first season at the West High school auditorium. Frederick Toenniges is the conductor of this ensemble. On its first program Bernice Rickman, soprano, will be the guest artist, and Svendsen's Symphony No. 1 in D major will be featured. Two more concerts-on Feb. 4 and April 7-will complete the season. Marjorie Wigton, harpist, and Mario Silveira, baritone, round out the list of soloists.

Serge Prokofieff's new opera will be given its world première in Moscow some time in December. The eminent Russian composer has chosen to call his new work "Son of the People."

Abba Leifer, organist, will give a recital this afternoon at 4:30 o'clock in the Rockefeller Memorial chapel, Woodlawn avenue and 59th street.

Next Sunday the Eva Jessye choir will make one of its infrequent appearances in these parts at the Du Sable High school. This is the Negro ensemble which functioned so admirably in the opera "Porgy and Bess," and has since made good on the concert platform. At the Du Sable concert, starting at 3 o'clock, the group Will offer spirituals, work songs and legends, Charleston street cries, selections from "Porgy and Bess," and a travesty of the "Wake Scene" from

the same opera. Gilman Chase, organist of the First Unitarian church, Woodlawn avenue and 57th street, will give the second of his series of six recitals tomorrow night in the church. Paul Hindemith's First Sonata will conclude a program also devoted to works of Frescobaldi Bach, and Philip James,
