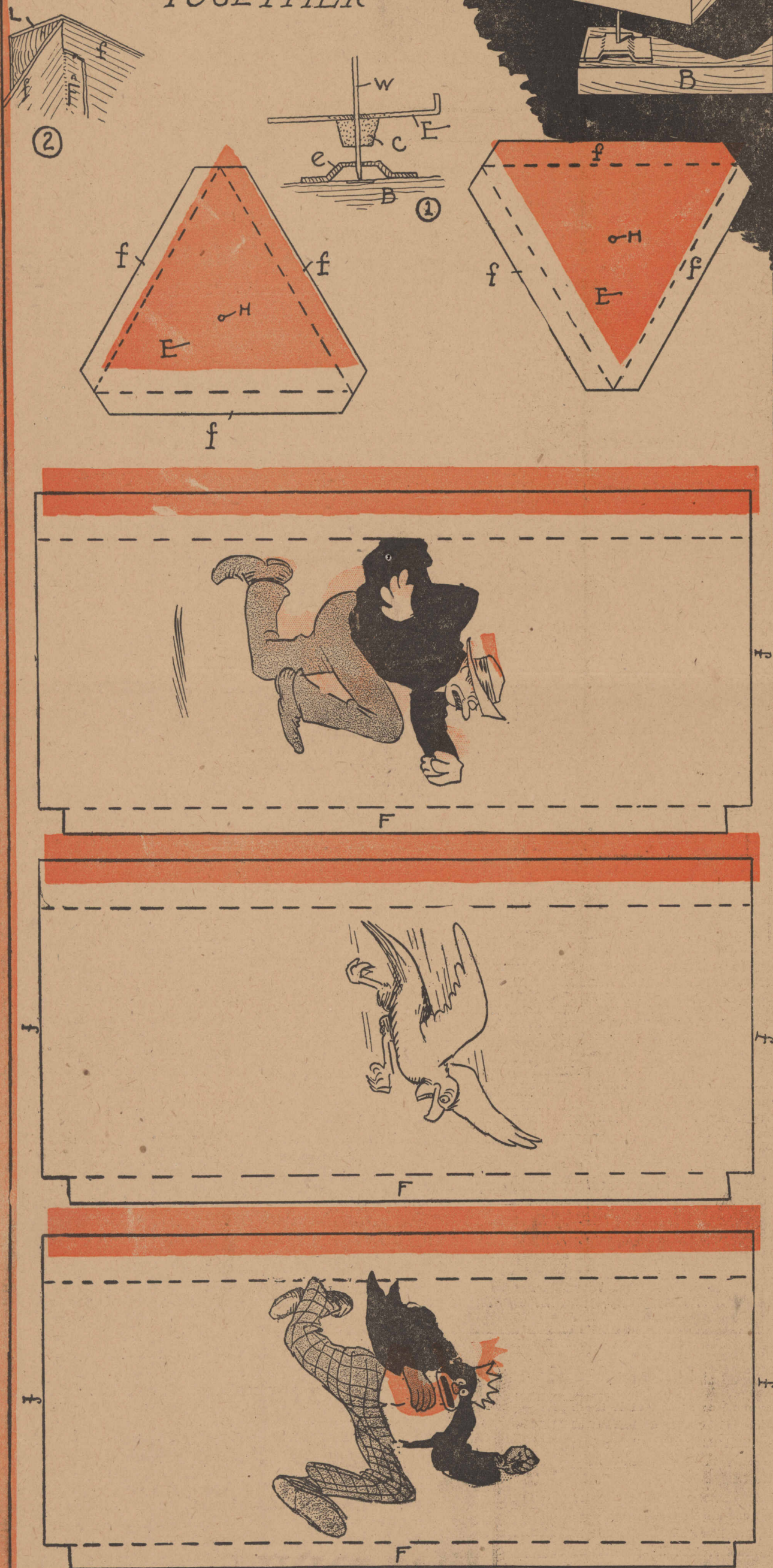


THE GIDDY WHIRL of MR. DREAMER, SAM AND THE PARROT.

A SIMPLE PATTERN WINDMILL TOY. CUT OUT AND PASTE TOGETHER



DIRECTIONS.

Paste the patterns on cardboard, about 3-ply. Cut out the outlines and crease with a dull table knife on the dotted lines and fold on the dotted lines. With liquid glue, glue the three lower pieces together, the flaps (F), gluing back of the flaps as in the little upper drawing numbered [2]. When all three are glued together you will have a three-cornered tube with a little flap sticking out of each corner.

The triangular pieces are now folded up and after the flaps (f, f, f.) are covered with liquid glue they are slipped inside of the

tube ends. The central holes are punched as marked at (H) and through these a wire hairpin is thrust. At the bottom a cork is glued as in the drawing [1] and the whole toy is now pivoted between brackets [B]. The lower one has a little cardboard guide to hold the axle in the same place as at [c]. The lower end of the axle thus rests on the wood of the bracket, making a fine pivot.

When placed in the wind the toy will start to whirl and Mr. Dreamer will chase the inevitable Sambo, while Sambo chases the parrot, and the parrot in turn makes for Mr. Dreamer.

These Designs May Be Transferred to Cloth



DIRECTIONS.

If you follow the directions carefully, from three to five transfers can be made from the pattern on this page to cloth. The process is simple:

Spread your cloth upon a smooth, hard surface. Dampen the back of the pattern until you can see the print through the paper. Lay the paper upon the cloth, and with bowl of a spoon press down upon the cloth, being careful to press firmly and not tear the paper. If a dry piece of paper is laid over the dampened paper, the danger of tearing is lessened. By this means the pattern will be printed on the cloth.
