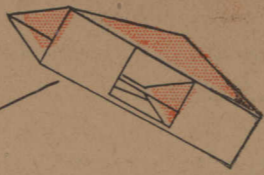
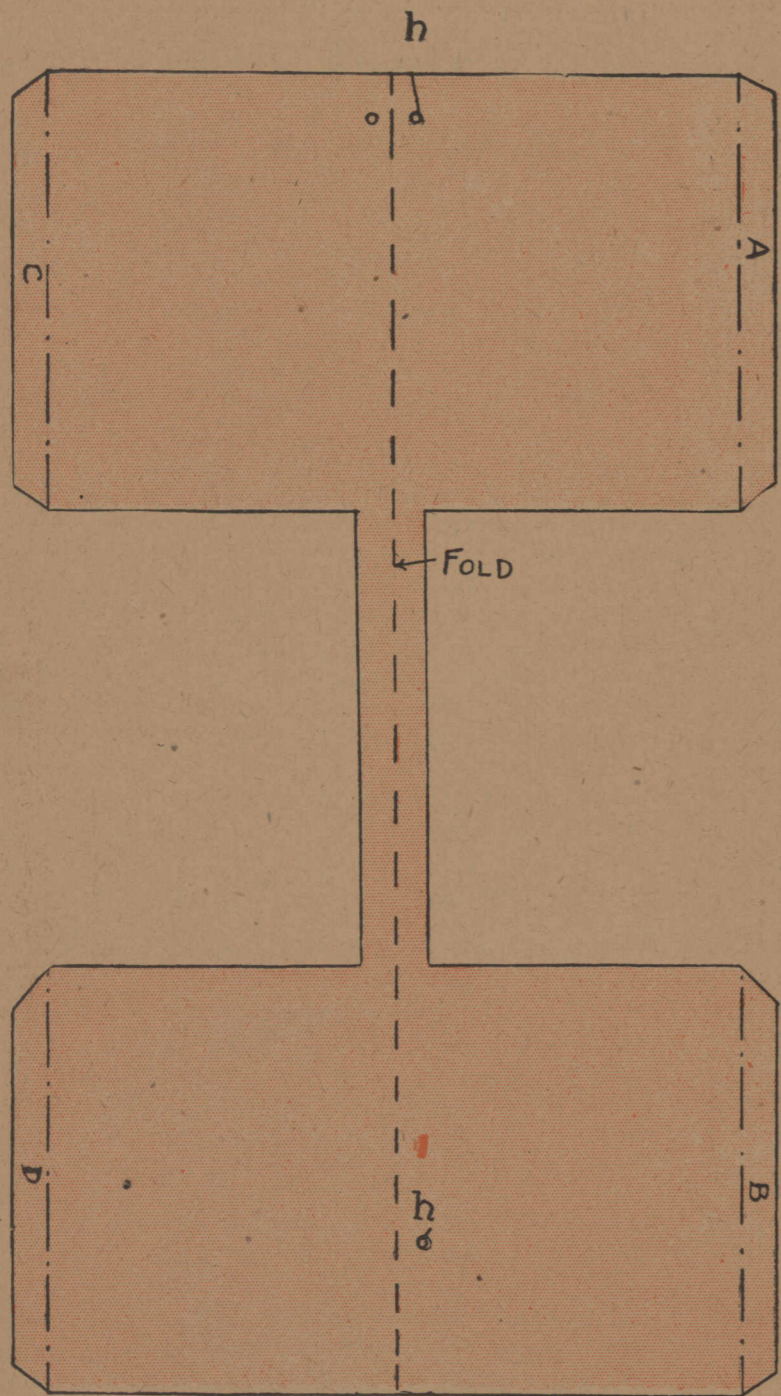
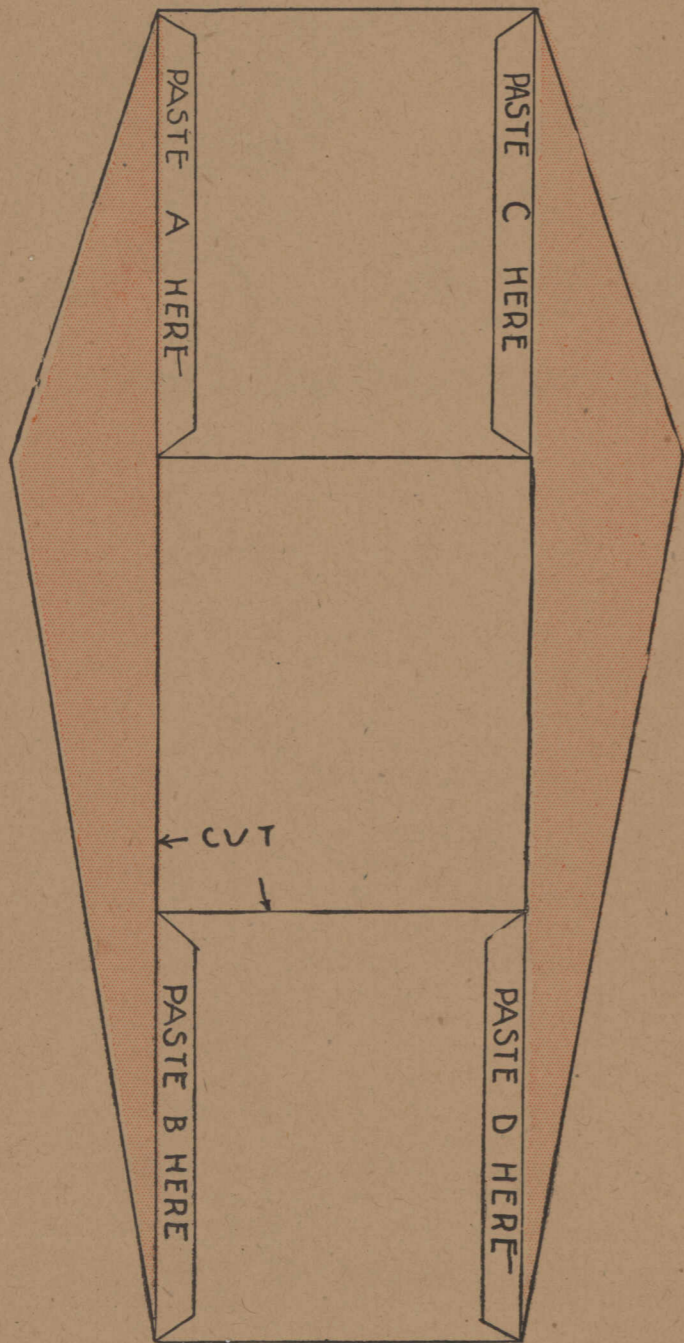


# HOW TO MAKE A PAPER KITE



CUT OUT THE PATTERNS AND  
FLY IT FROM THE PORCH  
A "JACK KNIFE" CUT-OUT



### DIRECTIONS.

These patterns do not need to be pasted to cardboard. Cut them out direct. Fold on the dotted lines, and the flaps A, B, C, D, in the opposite direction. Cut carefully, and on the full outline lines. Also the square opening in the big pattern.

Glue the flaps to the places marked and you have the kite finished.

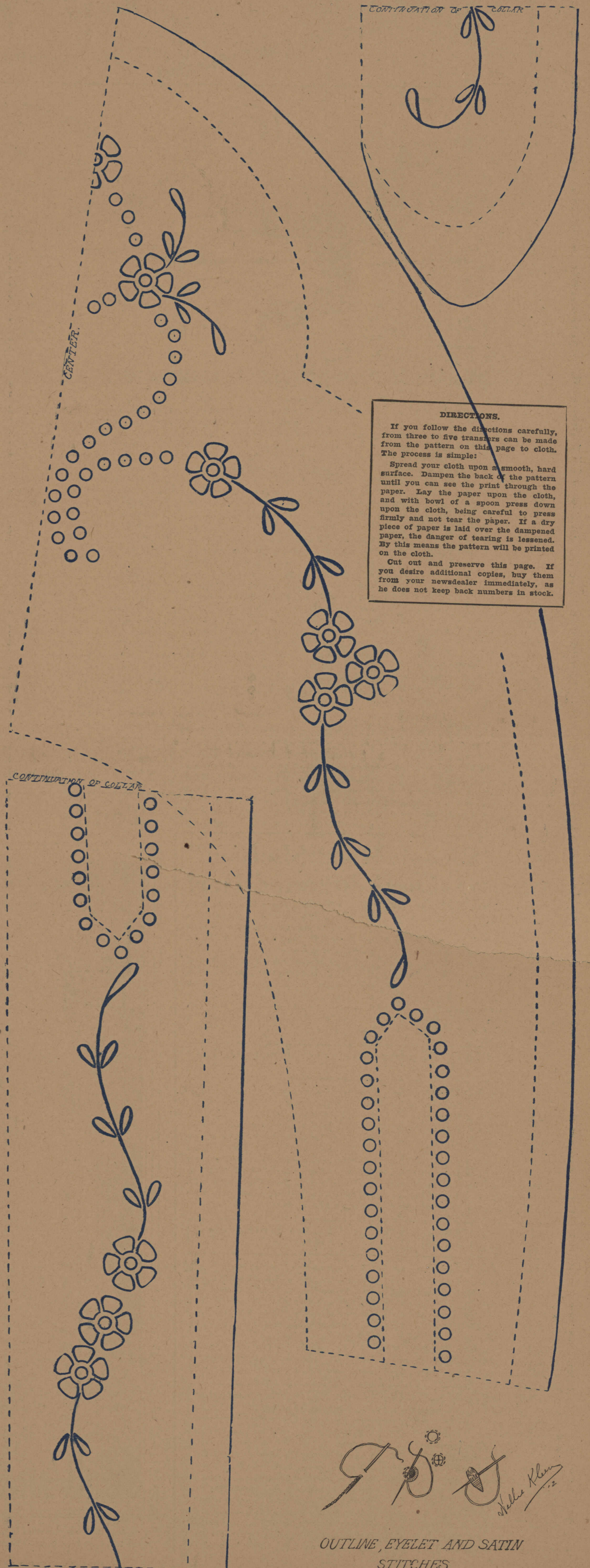
For the belly-band run a string, or a light thread preferably, between the holes (h, h).

Tie the main line to this thread between the ends. Slip it forward and try flying the kite. If it falls to rise slip the main line back on the belly-band thread. If it rises too sharply slip it further forward. When in the right place so it flies right fix it with a drop of glue.

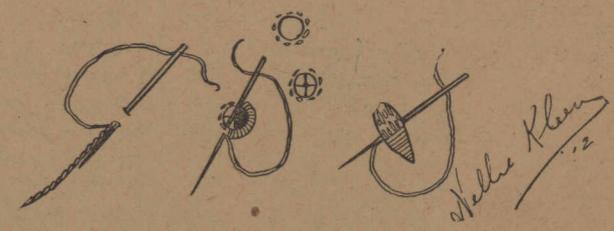
Fly the kite from off a porch but don't try it in too strong a wind or it will double up. If it tends to buckle too easily reinforce with angle strips of paper at the corners.

# ATTRACTIVE COLLAR DESIGN

These Designs May Be Transferred To Cloth.



**DIRECTIONS.**  
If you follow the directions carefully, from three to five transfers can be made from the pattern on this page to cloth. The process is simple:  
Spread your cloth upon a smooth, hard surface. Dampen the back of the pattern until you can see the print through the paper. Lay the paper upon the cloth, and with bowl of a spoon press down upon the cloth, being careful to press firmly and not tear the paper. If a dry piece of paper is laid over the dampened paper, the danger of tearing is lessened. By this means the pattern will be printed on the cloth.  
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
