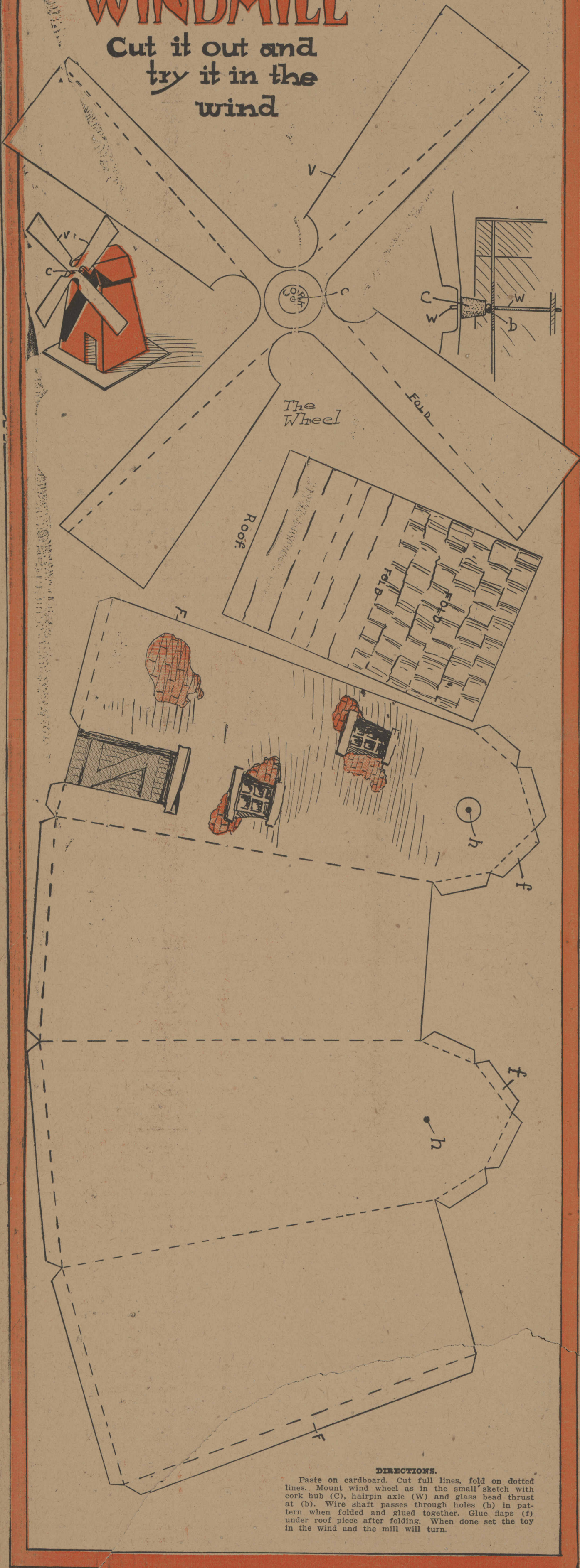


AN OLD DUTCH WINDMILL

Cut it out and
try it in the
wind



DIRECTIONS.
Paste on cardboard. Cut full lines, fold on dotted lines. Mount wind wheel as in the small sketch with cork hub (C), hairpin axle (W) and glass bead thrust at (b). Wire shaft passes through holes (h) in pattern when folded and glued together. Glue flaps (f) under roof piece after folding. When done set the toy in the wind and the mill will turn.

THREE TOWEL END DESIGNS

This Pattern can be Transferred to Cloth



DIRECTIONS.
If you follow the directions carefully, from three to five transfers can be made from the pattern on this page to cloth. The process is simple:
Spread your cloth upon a smooth, hard surface. Dampen the back of the pattern until you can see the print through the paper. Lay the paper upon the cloth, and with bowl of a spoon press down upon the cloth, being careful to press firmly and not tear the paper. If a dry piece of paper is laid over the dampened paper, the danger of tearing is lessened. By this means the pattern will be printed on the cloth.
