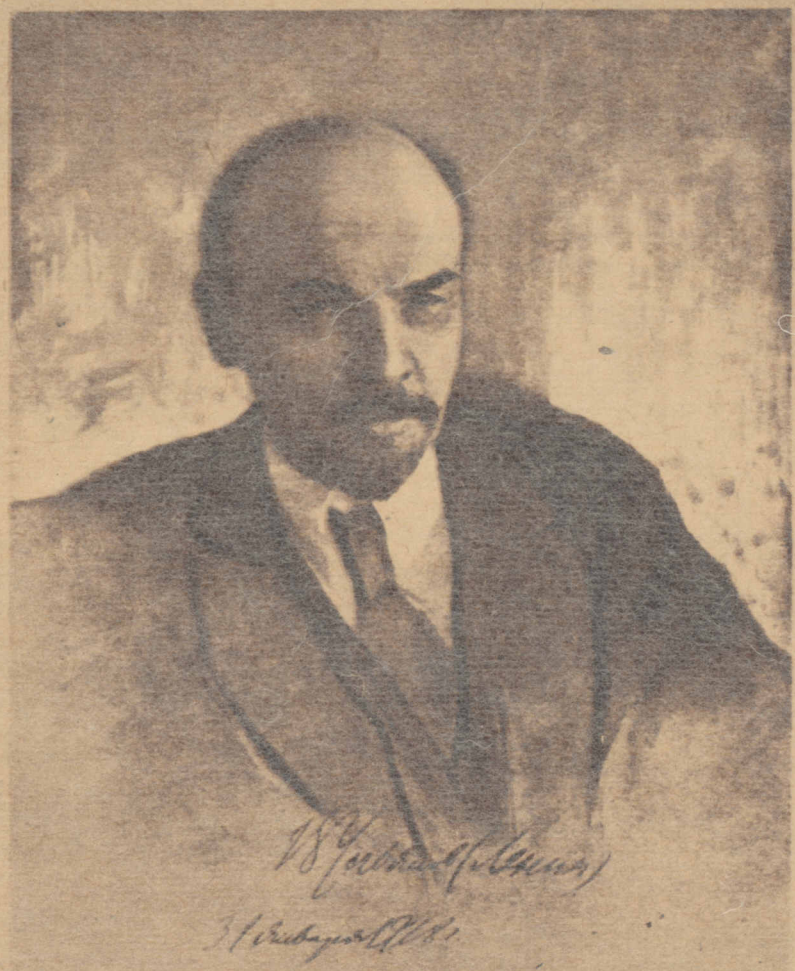

AS SEEN BY THEIR FRIENDS—Propaganda portraits, elaborately prepared and distributed throughout Russia during the period of Bolshevik rule. At the left, Lenin, otherwise Vladimir Ilitch Ulianoff, the virtual dictator of Bolshevik Russia and one of the few genuine Russians in the movement. At the right, Trotzky, the fiery Jew, who, as commissary for war, has been sarcastically dubbed by his opponents "the greatest Jewish general since Joshua." His real name is Leiba Bronstein.
