



VON MACKENSEN AS A LIEUTENANT AND AS HE IS NOW—The photograph to the left was taken forty-two years ago, when the famous field marshal was a young lieutenant of the Death's Head hussars. His signature appears on the photograph. To the right is a recent portrait showing the "Tiger of Germany" in his uniform of the regiment of hussars in which he has served since he first entered the army. At one time, when Von Mackensen was commander of the Death's Head hussars, the German crown prince was sent to Danzig by the kaiser to serve under the veteran as a punishment for an offense, and Von Mackensen is said to have treated the Hohenzollern heir very harshly.
