



THE MOST DRAMATIC INCIDENT IN THE PRIZE RING

The "long count" in the Dempsey-Tunney fight of September 22, 1927, in Chicago—Tunney, the champion, struggles to his feet, while Referee Barry, having suspended the count, pushes Dempsey toward a neutral corner. Barry acted in strict accordance with the rules, but the ex-champion's adherents claimed that Tunney was down for a count of fourteen.
