

cessful at the polls, giving the organization a percentage of .928 on that page.

The league placed seventeen aldermen in its "black box." Eight of these were nominated and nine were defeated, giving the league a percentage of .529 for "knocking 'em out." Averaging the scores, the final percentage is .728.

Two Women Beaten; Seven Win.
The only two women candidates who had opposition both suffered defeat—Miss Sara M. Hopkins in the Second ward and Mrs. Marie Gerhardt in the Twenty-third ward. Both are Democrats. Seven women, however, will have their names on the ballot at the election April 7. Six of these were unopposed, while the seventh, Mrs. B. Napier-alski, was nominated by Progressives in the Twelfth ward, who wrote in her name on the ballot.

The other women nominated are:

First ward—Miss Marion H. Drake, Progressive.

Sixth ward—Mrs. Josephine C. Kaneko, Socialist.

Seventh ward—Mrs. Lida E. McDermut, Socialist.

Twentieth ward—Mrs. Gertrude R. Dublin, Socialist.

Thirtieth ward—Mrs. Julia Agnew, Progressive, and Mrs. Maude J. Ball, Socialist.

The closest contest was in the Fourteenth ward, where W. R. Nealeigh, backed by "Billy" Galling, beat the Progressive organization candidate, C. G. Dixon, by only three votes. A contest is expected to follow. In the Twenty-third ward, the home of Mayor Harrison, the H-H candidate, Adolph D. Weiner, was the victor by a margin of only twenty-three votes. One of these was cast by Mrs. Harrison. The mayor's illness kept him at home.

Effort to Beat Miss Drake Fails.

An effort to sidetrack Miss Marion Drake, Progressive candidate in the First ward, failed. Friends of Karl N. Wehle, whose petition was knocked out a few days ago, tried to nominate him by writing in his name, but were only able to muster twenty-one votes, against 262 cast for Miss Drake. Of Wehle's supporters fourteen were women.

The second ward Democratic contest was between Thomas T. Hoyne, a brother of the state's attorney, and Miss Hopkins. Hoyne won by 311 votes. On the Republican side, Ald. Norris was successful in a close race with William R. Cowan, a negro.

The third ward Democratic race proved a walkaway for Jacob Lindheimer, who was supported by all factions of his party against Daniel J. Fitzpatrick. Former Ald. William J. Pringle won the Republican nomination over O. E. Weber, while Joe F. Longenecker captured the Progressive title from William J. Kotzenberg.

Martin Beaten in Fifth.

The fifth ward witnessed the defeat of Ald. Charles Martin by 565 votes. Thomas A. Doyle was the victor. He was backed by a combination of forces, made up largely of the younger men of the ward who resented Martin's long hold on the office.

Martin had been vigorously opposed by the M. V. L. The mention of his name in connection with a stock certificate of the Chicago Reduction company also figured in his retirement. Both men and women of the ward favored Doyle over Martin, the returns disclosed.

M. M. Marks won the Democratic nomination in the Sixth ward. He defeated Henry A. De Masi and Ben K. Korn. This is State's Attorney Hoyne's ward. De Masi was reported to have been identified with the H-H faction, with which Hoyne is closely allied. Ald. Willis O. Nance, strongly endorsed by the M. V. L., easily won the Republican nomination from R. R. Bowen.

Bamrick Wins in Seventh.

R. P. Bamrick, who has been opposed to the H-H element, was the Democratic winner in the Seventh over John H. Haskell, listed as the Harrison choice, and John C. Behrer, John F. Stewart, backed by the Deneen organization routed Harry Swan, the Harmony league candidate, and William S. Stahl for the Republican nomination.

In the Eighth ward the H-H band is credited with a victory in the nomination of Stanley Block, while in the Ninth ward Ald. Eugene Block, approved by the M. V. L., had little trouble in winning renomination.

James McNichols, who is said to train with the H-H faction, defeated Ald. Frank J. Vavrick identified with Congress and Sen. Atch's organization, in the Tenth ward. In the Eleventh ward Ald. Beversdorf, a henchman of "Tony" Cermak, balliff of the Municipal court, was defeated by another Cermak aid, G. F. Pettikoe, allied with the United So. Ieties. John I. Bagdzinas won the Republican nomination from William Berg by 310. The former was backed by the Deneen organization.

Novak Easily in Twelfth.

Ald. Joseph I. Novak, an H-H follower, won in the Twelfth ward by nearly 3,000 over two opponents, while in the Thirteenth Ald. Frank McDonald, also of the mayor's set, was victorious by 2,400 over a field of three.

There were two spirited contests in the Fourteenth ward, the home of Roger Sullivan and Postmaster Dan Campbell. Joseph Higgins Smith, the Sullivan entry, ran away from Ald. Clancy, the H-H candidate, while on the Republican side former Ald. Charles J. Lucas defeated Harry W. Meneley, backed by the G. O. P. organization. Lucas was not fought by the Campbell-Deneen men, however. He had been offered their endorsement and declined to run after Meneley was entered. Then he decided to get into the race.

Edward J. Kaindl, running under the Sullivan colors, defeated Leopold J. Arnstein, the H-H choice, by nearly 1,400 in the Fifteenth ward. Ald. Albert W. Beilfuss, backed by the Deneen organization and supported by the M. V. L., won easily over Marcus J. Golden.

Stanley Kunz Gets Setback.

The two candidates sponsored by Ald. Stanley Kunz in the Sixteenth and Seventeenth wards were vanquished. Ald. John Czeka, picked by the M. V. L. to deprive Kunz of an extra vote in the council, beat John Szynkowski by 10 votes. In the Seventeenth ward, William S. Swiney, endorsed by the M. V. L., defeated Stanley Adamkiewicz by 304 votes.

Dr. George A. Jett, the M. V. L. choice in the Eighteenth ward, won by a plurality of 917 for the Democratic nomination over two opponents.

The Twentieth ward not only furnished the excitement of the day, but was also pleasing to good government advocates who long have been waging a fight on the Sabbath-Hearst-Harrison organization in that balliwick. The defeat of "Morrie" Abrahams and Ald. Hugo L. Pitte, politicians believe, portends hard sledding for Congressman Sabbath himself in the election as a candidate this fall. The defeat of Ald. Vavrick in the Tenth also was a blow to the Sabbath clan.

Novak Supplants Sabbath.

Edward J. Novak, the Sullivan leader in the Fifth district, supplants Sabbath by the Twentieth ward result. The retirement of Pitte and the possibility of the election of two Sullivan aldermen in the ward in April materially lessens the power of the H-H combination in the foreign section of the west side. The defeated organization has been running things with a high hand in the ghetto, as the recent school sites scandal indicated. Matt Frenkel, who beat Abrahams badly, was endorsed by the M. V. L.

The mayor was saved the ignominy of suffering a defeat in his home ward by his recent removal from the Twenty-first, where he long had lived. "Hot Steve" Jimmy Quinn, one of the Harrison henchmen, was routed in the ward by John F. O'Malley, Sullivan leader.

O'Malley's candidate, W. F. Schofield, beat
