WOODROW WILSON, TWENTY-SEVENTH PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES—Born Staunton, Va., Dec. 28, 1856; son of the Rev. Joseph R. and Jessie Woodrow Wilson; Scotch-Irish ancestry on both sides; educated at Davidson college, North Carolina; Princeton, and Johns Hopkins; practiced law in Atlanta, Ga.; taught at Bryn Mawr, Wesleyan, and Princeton; president of Princeton, 1902-1910; governor of New Jersey, 1911-1913; elected president of the United States in November, 1912; re-elected November, 1916; married Ellen Louise Axson of Savannah, Ga., 1885 (died 1914), and Mrs. Norman Galt, 1915; three daughters; author of various works on history and political economy.
