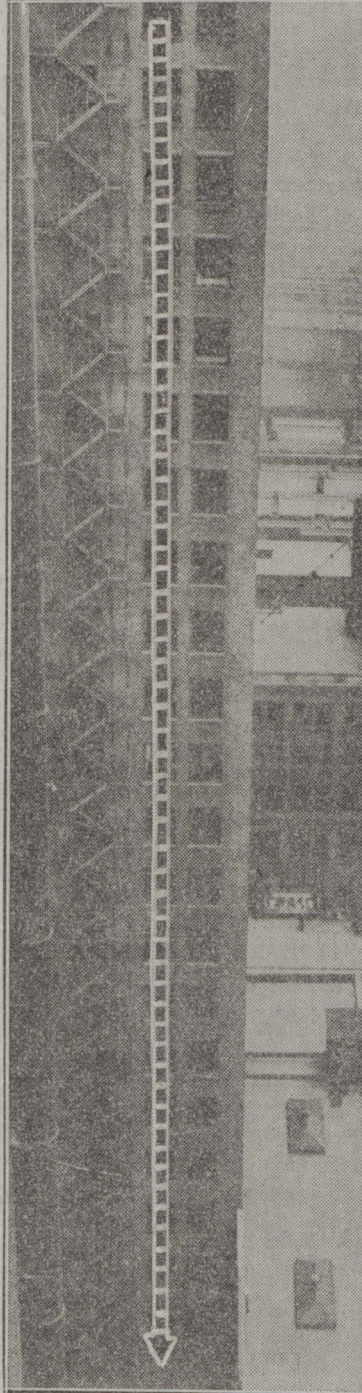


DIAGRAM OF LEAP. Photo-diagram showing how Rebecca Roche plunged from 23d floor window to death.
