Soviets' No. 2 man denies Kremlin split

MOSCOW—Mikhail Gorbachev's No. 2 man, Yegor Ligachev, broke his silence Saturday on reports that he leads a conservative faction opposed to Gorbachev's reforms. He said enemies are trying to divide a leadership united behind Gorbachev. "Adversaries in the West, and some people in our country too, are making allegations about differences among the Soviet leadership in the Politburo," the 67-year-old Ligachev said. He said the Soviet Union's enemies are foolish to try to divide the leadership. "All the members of the leadership, with Mikhail Gorbachev at their head, are deeply committed to the cause of perestroika," or restructuring, he said. Ligachev, a full member of the 13-man ruling Politburo in charge of Communist Party ideology, had indicated in earlier speeches that Gorbachev's policy of glasnost, or openness, had gone too far in criticizing past economic and social policies.

Waldheim welcomed in Saudi Arabia

JIDDA, Saudi Arabia—Austrian President Kurt Waldheim, under fire in the West but revered by Arabs, received a warm welcome Saturday when he arrived in Saudi Arabia for a three-day visit aimed at boosting economic ties. Waldheim, met by King Fahd, was to start official talks on Sunday. Waldheim, 69, has been harshly attacked in the West over allegations linking him to war crimes while serving in the Nazi army during World War II. But he is still hailed in the Arab world as a man who spoke out for Palestinian rights while secretary-general of the United Nations in the 1970s.

Colombian president cancels trip to U.S.

BOGOTA, Colombia—Colombian President Virgilio Barco Vargas canceled a trip to the United States on Saturday because of a political crisis stemming from the week-old kidnaping of Alvaro Gomez Hurtado, a Conservative Party politician who lost to Barco in the 1986 elections. Since the kidnaping, residents of the capital have taken to the streets on several occasions to wave white handkerchiefs in protest and demand Gomez's release and peace in Colombia. Barco had planned to leave for Washington on Sunday.

2 new warrants in '78 Moro murder

ROME—Ten years after the murder of former Prime Minister Aldo Moro, Italian magistrates have issued arrest warrants for two guerrillas accused of involvement in his kidnaping, judicial sources said on Saturday. They said the warrants for the two fugitive members of the Red Brigades were thought to result from evidence provided by a jailed guerrilla who also took part in the crime. The sources said the warrants were issued against Alessio Casimirri and Alvaro Lojacono. In 1983, 32 Red Brigades guerrillas were convicted of involvement in the Moro case. Twenty-two were given life terms. Moro's bullet-riddled body was found in the back of a car parked in a Rome street on May 9, 1978, 55 days after he was kidnaped.

36 Mexican aliens found in desert

TUCSON—Thirty-six undocumented Mexican aliens who said they were on their way to look for farm work were found Saturday wandering without food or water in the searing Sonora desert north of Tucson. The 35 men and one woman, whom officials said had been walking four days since crossing the border onto the Tohono O'odham Indian Reservation, were in generally good condition. They were treated at Northwest Hospital, then released to the custody of the Border Patrol. The group was rescued after two of its members sought help at a ranch.

2 killed in shooting at Brooklyn dance

NEW YORK—Two people died and five others were wounded when a gunman fired into a crowd at a Brooklyn dance early Saturday, police said. The gunman sprayed the crowd of about 70 people with bullets and then fled, said Sgt. Maurice Howard, a police spokesman. He said authorities have no clues why the attack occurred, adding that witnesses said the gunman walked into the club and fired at manager Dennis James, 33, who was dead at the scene. The gunman then turned his weapon on the crowd, killing Tracy Brown, 16, and wounding five other patrons. Howard said one witness described the man's weapon as a machine gun.
