

REVOLTA TAKES ILLINOIS GOLF CROWN 5TH TIME

Johnny Beats Laffoon by Three Strokes

BY CHARLES BARTLETT John Frank Revolta, a big timer since he won the 1935 National professional and Western Open championships, hasn't made much of a mark in the major leagues of late.

Three shots away from Revolta, whose three rounds were 71, 66, and 71, was Ky Laffoon, who uses St. Andrews as an address in Kentucky, who led all of our town's qualifiers for the United States Open on this same course a week ago, couldn't better his opening 69s with anything stouter than a 73 and settled for second place at 211.

Tied for third were two of the district's newcomers—Ernie Ball of Oak Park and Jimmy Hines of North Shore, Ernie, No. 1 Illinois qualifier for the forthcoming P. G. A., hung up a 215 on a 73-71-71, while Hines had 71-73, and 71.

Revolta, who came to Evanston in the 1936 season, won the Illinois P. G. A. that year and the following two, then came back in 1941 to make it No. 4. Babe, 2 Other U.S. Stars Win in British Golf

GULLA, N.E. Scotland, June 9 (AP)—All three American seekers of the British women's amateur golf title—Mildred (Babe) Diridrick Zaharias of Denver, Helen Sigel of Philadelphia, and Ruth Woodward of Fall River, Mass.—moved into the third round today with golf that almost any man would envy.

Mrs. Zaharias, currently the United States queen, blasted her way past a pair of opponents as expected, but what surprised the gallery was the way Miss Sigel, a quiet Philadelphia miss with flashing brown eyes, demolished her two foes.

Outdrives Foe 100 Yards The Babe, one time Olympic javelin thrower and twice picked as the most outstanding woman athlete in the United States, defeated Helen Nimmo, a tall Gullane native, 6 and 5, in the morning round, sometimes outdriving her opponent by as much as 100 yards. In the afternoon she engineered a 4 and 2 verdict over Mrs. Enid Sheppard of England.

Wins 7 and 6, 6 and 5 Miss Sigel, consistent despite an injured left wrist, eliminated the chic Mme. Philippe Eloy of Morfontaine, France, in the morning, but a 7 and 6 margin and then came back after lunch to sidetrack Mrs. J. N. Duncan, former Scottish champion, 6 and 5.

Miss Woodward eliminated Mrs. A. H. H. Gilligan, 5 and 3, in her first round and disposed of Nancy Jupp, Wales, 2 up, after a shaky start in her second outing. She sank a 50 foot putt to gain her advantage.

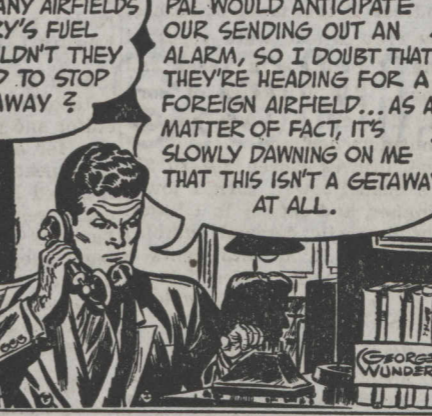

SULLIVAN WINS CITY LEAGUE NET CROWN 2D YEAR

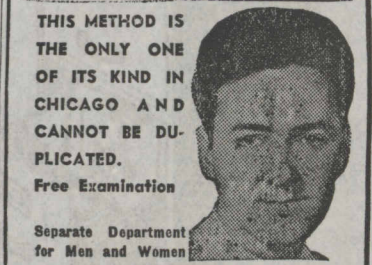

Dante Vicini of Ottawa, Ill., four times Cook county amateur golf champion and 1945 Tribune All-Star winner, shot a 76 yesterday to lead a field of 58 in the opening round of the United States Public Links trials at Bunker Hill Golf club.

Two other members of the Vicini family played the preliminary match. Fred Vicini carded a qualifying 80 to lead brother Armand by seven strokes. Among the 15 qualifiers were Jack Atten, 21, pro of Chick Evans, with an 80, and Jack Dwan, Loyola university basketball star, with 83.

Public links amateurs from the west side will qualify tomorrow at White Pine Golf club, while south sliders get their chance at Cherry Hills Friday. An estimated 50 qualifiers from the three preliminary rounds will enter the 36 hole Chicago finals July 2 at Ridge Country club. The three low scorers at Ridge will form the team representing the Illinois section in the championship over Meadowbrook Golf course in Minneapolis, Minn., July 21-26.

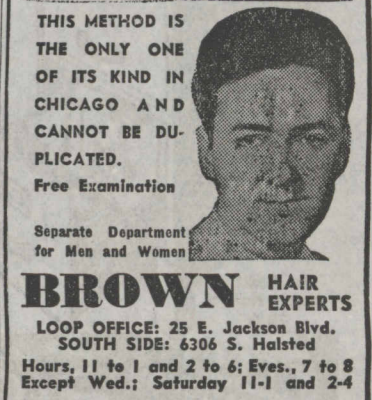

EX-WRESTLER, 63, DIES

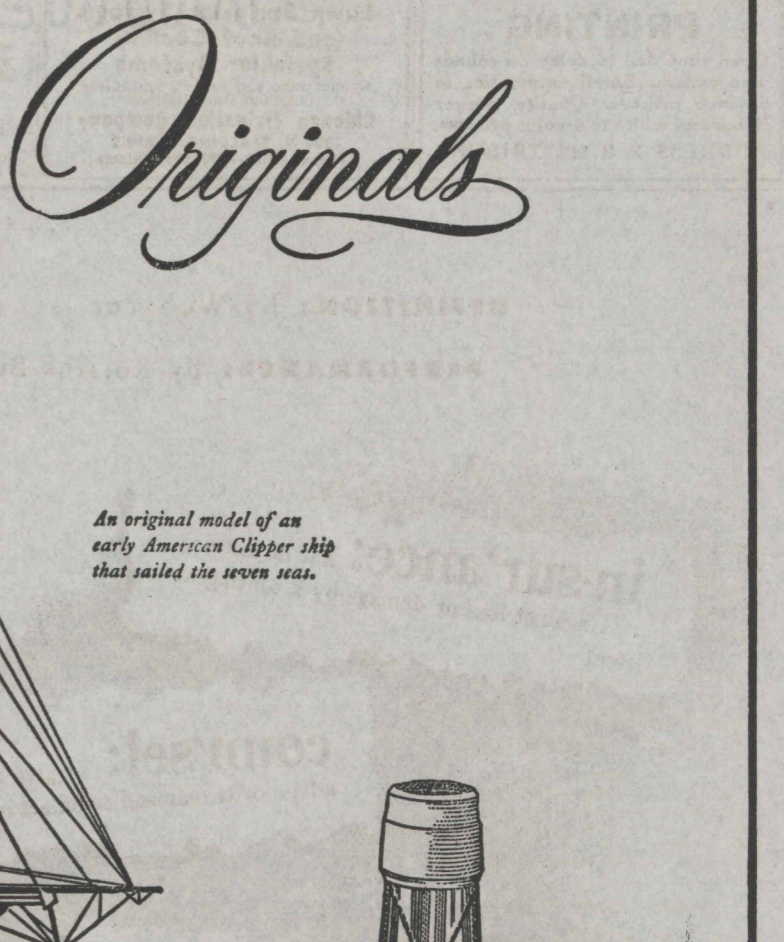
