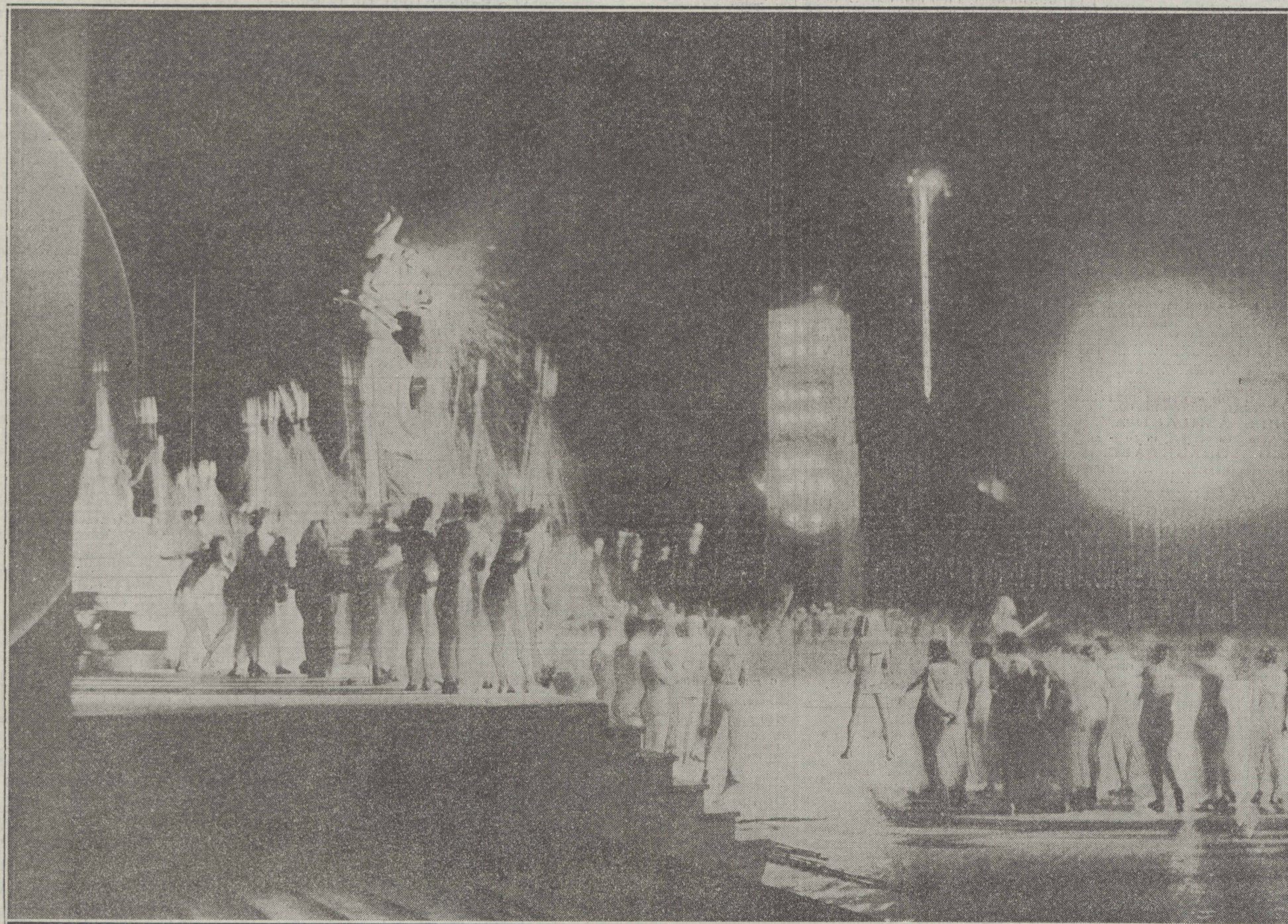
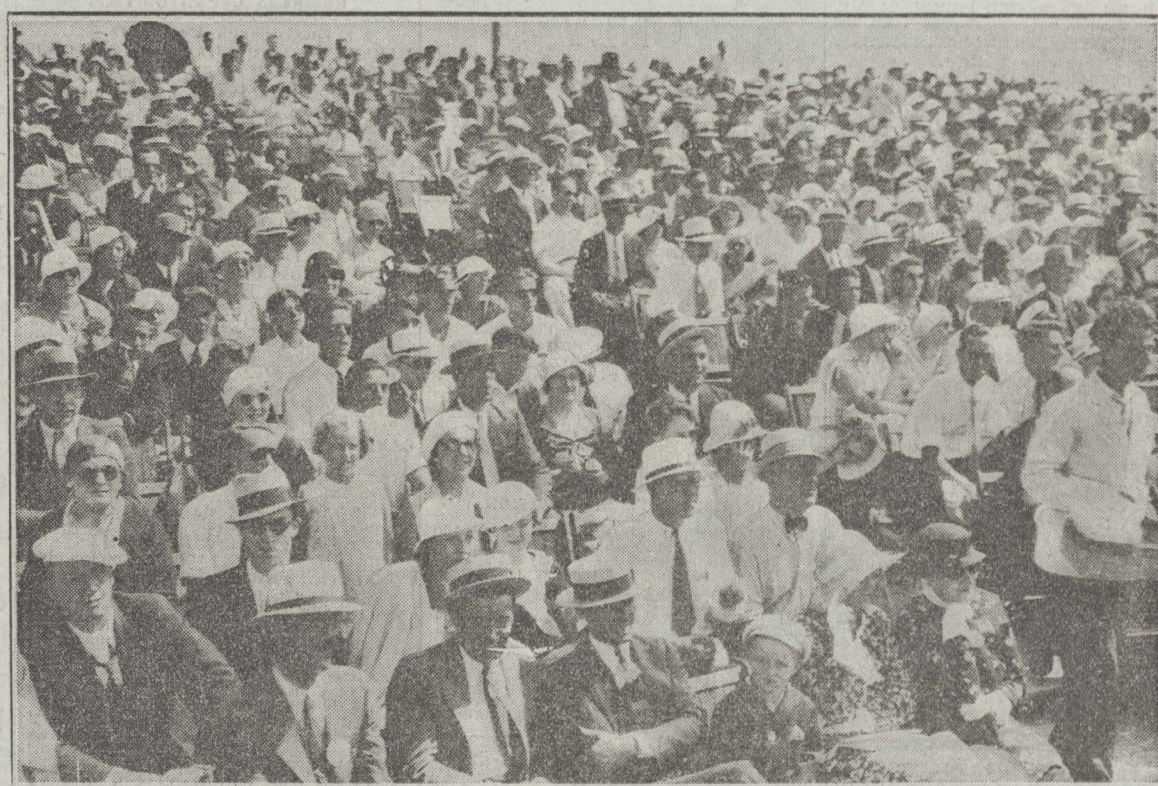


Crowd of 125,000 Sees Monster Jewish Spectacle in Soldiers' Field—Throng Gets Thrills at Air Races

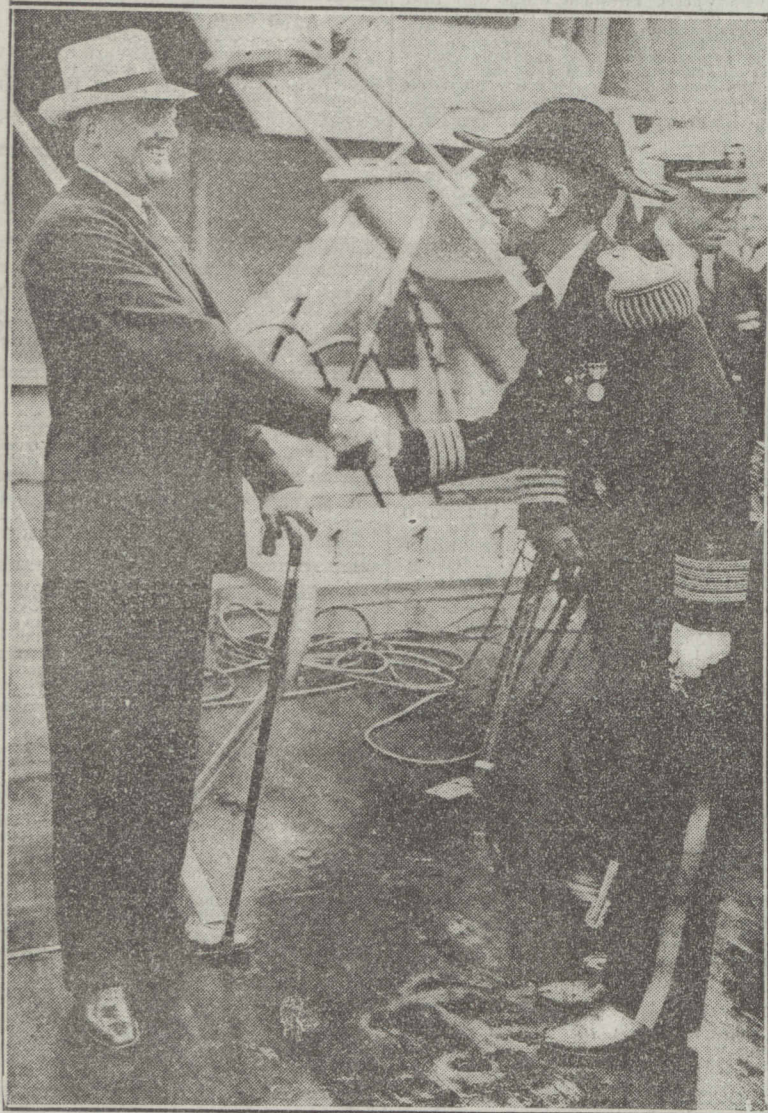

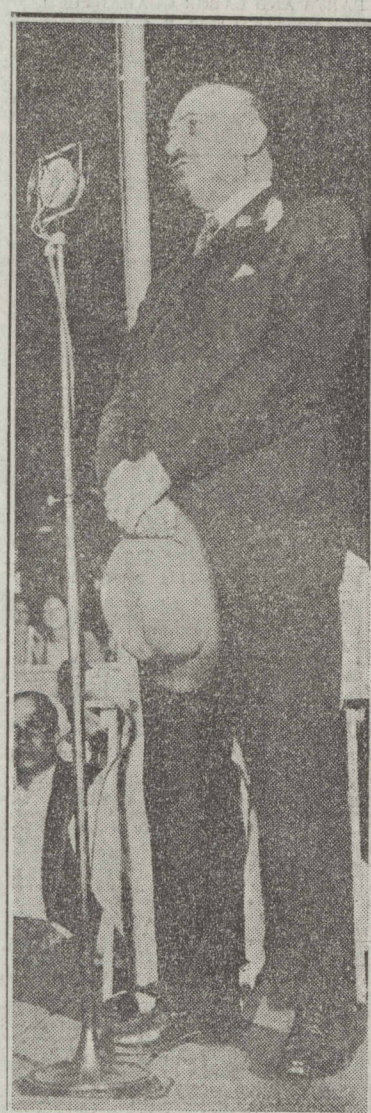

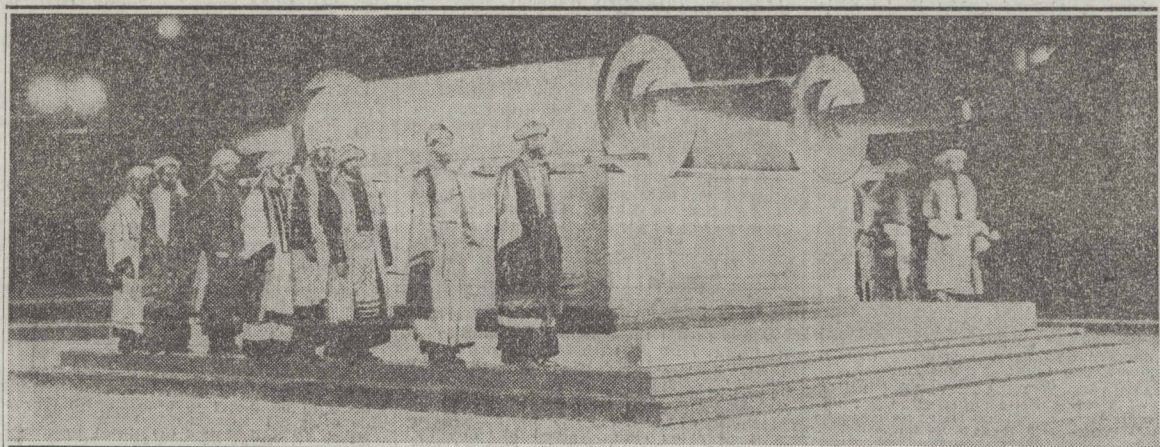

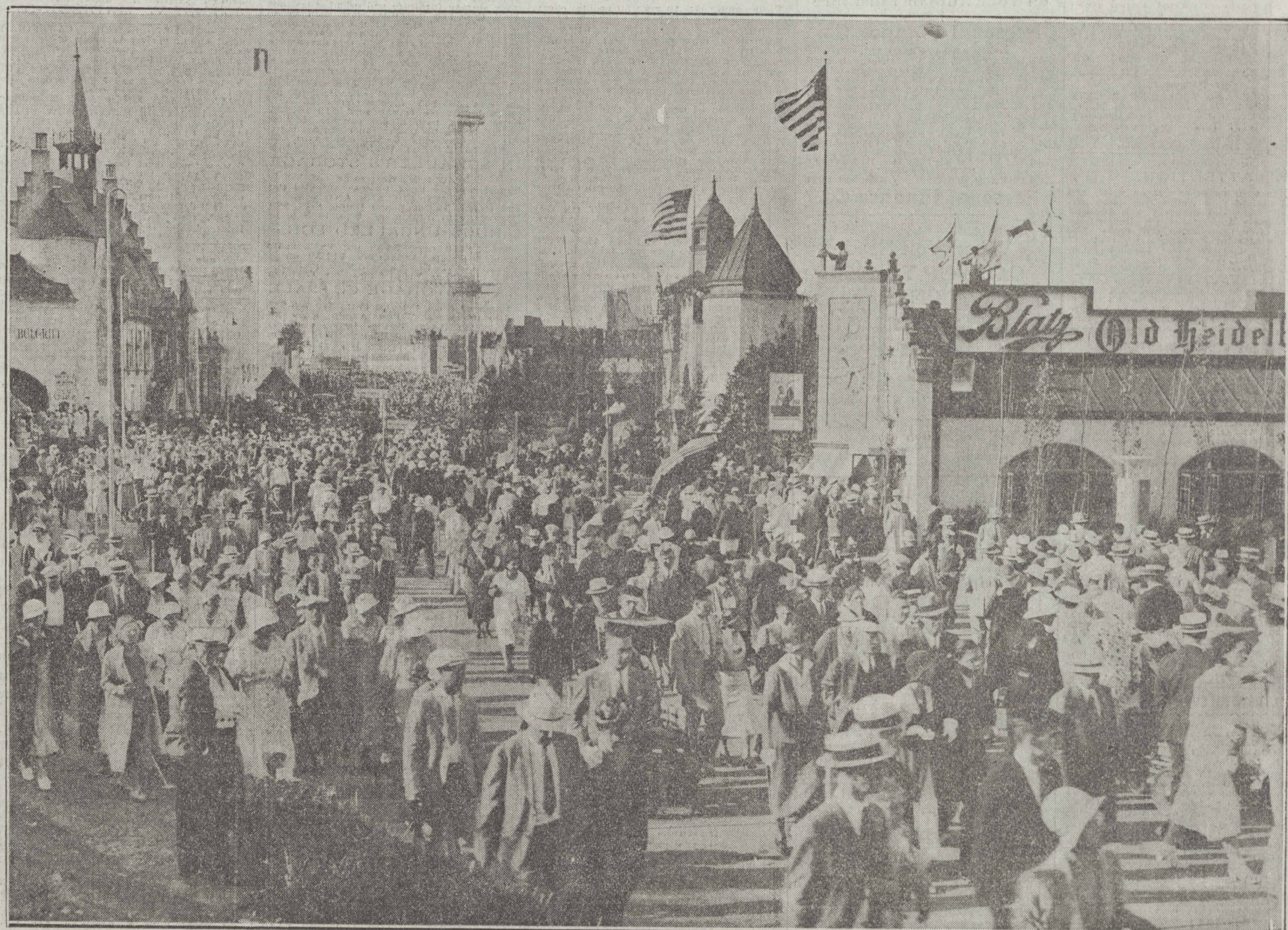
