SCOTS SEE THEIR QUEEN, 'A BONNIE LASS,' AND KING

Pay Honor to Rulers on
Post-Coronation Visit.

EDINBURGH, Scotland, July 5.—(P)—The keys of this ancient capital of Scotland were presented to new sovereigns today as King George VI. and Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain arrived for a post-coronation visit through their northern realm.

Princesses Elizabeth, heir presumptive to the throne, and Margaret Rose accompanied their parents as they rode in an open carriage down stately Princes' street between cheering throngs. The royal salute of twenty-one guns roared from Edinburgh castle on its crag above the city.

Sergeant Thinks Queen O. K. For the queen, daughter of a Scottish earl, it was a triumphal homecoming. As she walked with the king to review ex-service men Ex-Sergt. George Alexander, 84 years old, greeted her in the burr of the Highlands.

"You're a bonnie lassie," he said. "I wish I'd courted you myself." The queen stopped and talked with him about Aberdeen, his home. The royal party took up residence in Holyrood palace, where they will be at home until Sunday. Then they will travel south through Glasgow and other Scottish cities en route to Wales to make a similar visit. The lord provost, Louis Gumley, tendered the city's keys to King George on a red satin cushion and welcomed the new monarch to his "ancient and hereditary kingdom of Scotland."

King Trusts Keys to Official. The king returned the keys, assuring the lord provost he entrusted them to his keeping. There was a similar ceremony at Holyrood palace, where the keys of that historic royal residence were handed the king by a representative of the duke of Hamilton, hereditary keeper.

The royal procession down Princes' street was led by the duke of Atholl at the head of a troop of Scottish horse on shaggy Highland ponies. The men wore the same khaki uniforms, slouch hats, and black coats' feathers last worn during the 1903 post-coronation visit of King Edward VII. Mounted Royal Scots Grays rode before and behind the sovereigns' carriage.

The king was in the dress uniform of admiral of the fleet. The queen wore forget-me-not blue and the princesses strawberry pink coats.

EIGHT PLUNGERS IN POKER GAME WIND UP UNHURT

A nice sociable eight handed poker game was in progress last night on the rear porch of Albert Benedict's second floor flat at 723 Forest avenue, Oak Park. Between hands Mr. Benedict would tap a keg of beer for refreshment.

2 FLYING BOATS HOP TO PIONEER ATLANTIC ROUTE

amptom Thursday and the Caledonia at Port Washington Friday.

Pan-American may, on the return trip, explore the southern route by way of the Azores and Bermuda. The American company has alternate landing facilities at Charleston, S. C., and Baltimore.

With Capt. Gray were First Officer William S. De Lima, Second Officer William Masland, Engineering Officer C. D. Wright, Assistant Engineering Officer E. Walter Smith, Radio Officer T. J. Roberts, and Ship's Clerk William Thaler. The ship carried 2,300 gallons of gasoline and the Caledonia 2,320 gallons.

Have Same Cruising Speed. The two flying boats have approximately the same cruising speed. The Caledonia was built by Short Brothers. The Clipper is a Sikorsky and its engines have a total of 3,200 horse power. The two light commanders are each veterans of more than a million miles of flying.

Masland, of the Clipper crew, is a veteran of eight crossings of the Pacific, and Wright has fifteen Pacific crossings to his credit.

At the start of the flight the Clipper had the advantage of a tail wind of about 21 miles an hour and cruised at an air speed of 165.5 miles an hour. The Caledonia flew at a speed of about 125 miles an hour. The British ship had to fly lower and overcome the same winds which aided the American flying boat.

Others Survey Routes. In addition to the United States and Great Britain, France and Germany have announced survey flights across the Atlantic for this year, the former with the six engine flying boat, Lieutenant de Voiseau Paris, and the latter with two catapult seaplanes, Nordmeer and Nordwind. The German company, Lufthansa, conducted flights last year by way of the Azores.

The South Atlantic is being flown regularly with mail and cargo, but without passengers. Regular service is maintained between the United States and the Orient with flying boats. Until the destruction of the airship Hindenburg Germany maintained an air route over the North Atlantic during the spring, summer, and early fall months.

FLYER CRASHES PLANE TO AVERT SMASH IN MIDAIR

To avoid colliding in mid-air with two men in a heavier plane which had just taken off, John B. Anderson, 27 years old, an amateur pilot, deliberately pancaked his light monoplane yesterday evening at the Pal-Waukee airport, in Wheeling. He escaped with a bruised wrist and a torn shirt.

Returning from Danville, Anderson, who lives at 1260 North Dearborn street, saw a biplane about to leave the runway. He circled the field at an altitude of 100 feet, according to William Turgeon, an instructor. Then, as the biplane took the air and started aloft, Turgeon said Anderson apparently thought the two ships would crash.

Anderson kicked over the rudder, stalling his engine, Turgeon declared. The little Taylor-Cub plane swung about and plopped down, breaking the landing gear and propeller. The men in the other ship continued on their way, unaware of his daring deed. Anderson, who has been flying only two months, obtained his pilot's license a week ago.

PLANE RACES FOR YUKON TO BLAZE NEW AIR TRAIL

ABOARD EDMONTON-YUKON PLANE (via Radio to Edmonton, Alta.), July 5.—(P)—This pontooned monoplane, trail blazing a new air mail and passenger route 1,200 miles from Edmonton to Whitehouse, Yukon territory, turned westward up the Laird pass in northern British Columbia today in a dawn to dusk flight.

Sponsors said the new route will, within a year, bring San Francisco and Chicago within twelve hours of Alaska. They said Canadian air services, operating between Alaska or the Yukon territory and Montana, will carry free all mail originating in the United States or Alaska and consigned to the other.

As the plane flew west and north over virtually uncharted country and among snow capped peaks passengers and crew of the United Air Transport plane kept watch for J. O. Phillips, St. Louis, Mo., business man, en route from Edmonton in his plane on a pleasure jaunt to Whitehorse alone.

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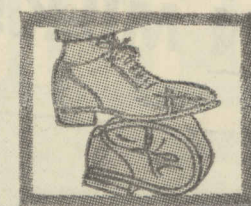

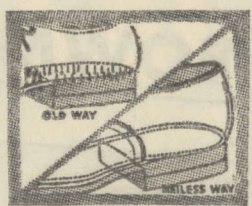

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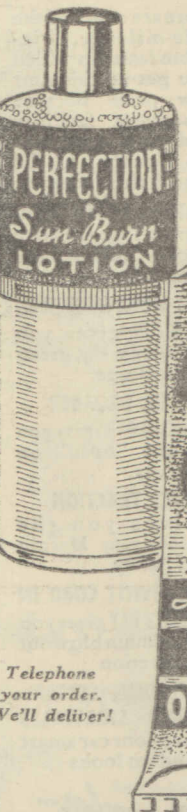
