DEMAND DEATH
FOR CONFESSED
STRANGLER OF 3

Wife, Held for Her Safety,
Still Has Faith.

Los Angeles, Cal., July 5.—(Special.)—A demand for the death of Albert Dyer, confessed strangler of three little girls June 26 in the hills west of the city, was voiced today by District Attorney Byron Fitts. The slayer, worn by thirty-six hours of grilling which brought his confession last night, paced his cell nervously near by. Occasionally he screamed in fear.

The prosecutor said three murder charges would be filed against Dyer, one each for the killing of Madeline Everett, 7 years old; her sister Melba, 8, and their playmate, Jeanette Stephens, 9.

Dyer, a WPA employé placed to guard a street crossing near Centinela Park in Inglewood, broke last night when police threatened to take him to Inglewood, where citizens milled angrily about the police station last week during the questioning of suspects.

Wife Disbelieves Admission.

Although Dyer confessed the deed in full, declaring that a sex craving was his only motive, his wife, when informed, raced to his side in the county jail and declared:

"He never did it!"
Dyer said he played with the three children in the park on the morning of their deaths and persuaded them to meet him in the Baldwin hills, which lie north of the suburb, to hunt rabbits.

The killer then related how he watched for the children, who "were dressed in bright colored clothes and looked fresh and nice," how he met them in the canyon and took them one by one out of the sight of the others and strangled them.

Goes Home to Dinner.

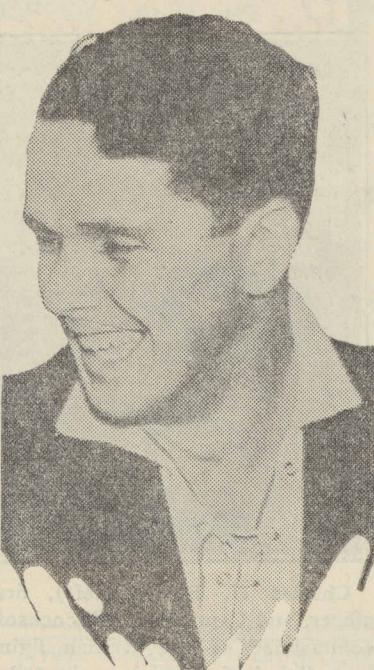
His clothing stained with blood, Dyer said, he hurried home and changed, then calmly ate a "good supper."

Although other witnesses turned up during the day to add circumstantial bits of evidence to Dyer's confession, authorities still were checking the possibility that another person may have been involved.

termine if Dyer may not have made the confession for a morbid thrill.

Merle Everett, father of two of the victims, said he did not believe Dyer's story. He said he did not think the children could have walked from the park to the scene of their death, about five miles. He held that some one took them there in an automobile.

George T. Ray, a medical clinic employé, today laid claim to rewards totaling \$5,000 for capture of the slayer. Police said, however, that an unnamed 12 year old Mexican boy probably would receive the major share of the money for an earlier identification of Dyer.

GERMANY RULES
ARMY GETS FIRST
CHOICE OF GRAIN

Calls for 10 to 20 Pct. of
Rye Harvest.

BERLIN, July 5.—Nazi agricultural authorities ruled today that all persons and offices buying rye from farmers must offer to the army every month a minimum of 10 to 20 per cent of the grain they purchase.

This is to make sure that the German army obtains from home producers the rye it needs for the famous dark bread, "kommisbrot"—regimental bread—its soldiers eat. It is also to insure a supply of oats for horses.

Provide Purchase Periods.

Under the ruling, 10 per cent of the purchased grain must be offered between July and September; 15 per cent until December and 20 per cent from January to March. Buyers of oats and fodder to be mixed with rye must offer 50 per cent of what they have bought to the army. If the army fails to buy all they offer, they may sell it to special offices controlling grain for the Nazi government.

Preparations of the agricultural office to control grain and other farm produce are more thorough this year than ever before. The regulations extend to all grain, legumes, fodder and buckwheat.

Horses Get Regular Fare.

In view of a shortage of oats the agricultural office suggested the army cut down the ration of its horses from six kilograms (13.2276 pounds) to five daily. The army pro-

8 DEFENDANTS FACE
ARRAIGNMENT TODAY
IN SCOTTSBORO CASE

Decatur, Ala., July 5.—(AP)—Eight Negroes will be arraigned in Circuit court here tomorrow to begin a new episode in the 6 year old legal drama known to millions as the "Scottsboro case."

Announcement by the prosecutor that the state was prepared to try all the defendants followed denial of compromise reports.

Judge W. W. Callahan, trial judge, said he knew "nothing of any compromise." Melvin Hutson, the solicitor, intimated all the Negroes will be tried after the hearing tomorrow.

Charged with raping Mrs. Victoria Price and Ruby Bates aboard a freight train March 25, 1931, the Negroes have been in jail since the date as their attorneys battled to save them from the electric chair.

The ninth defendant, Heywood Patterson, is under a 75 year sentence, expected to be appealed to the United States Supreme court, which has set aside two previous death verdicts in the case.
