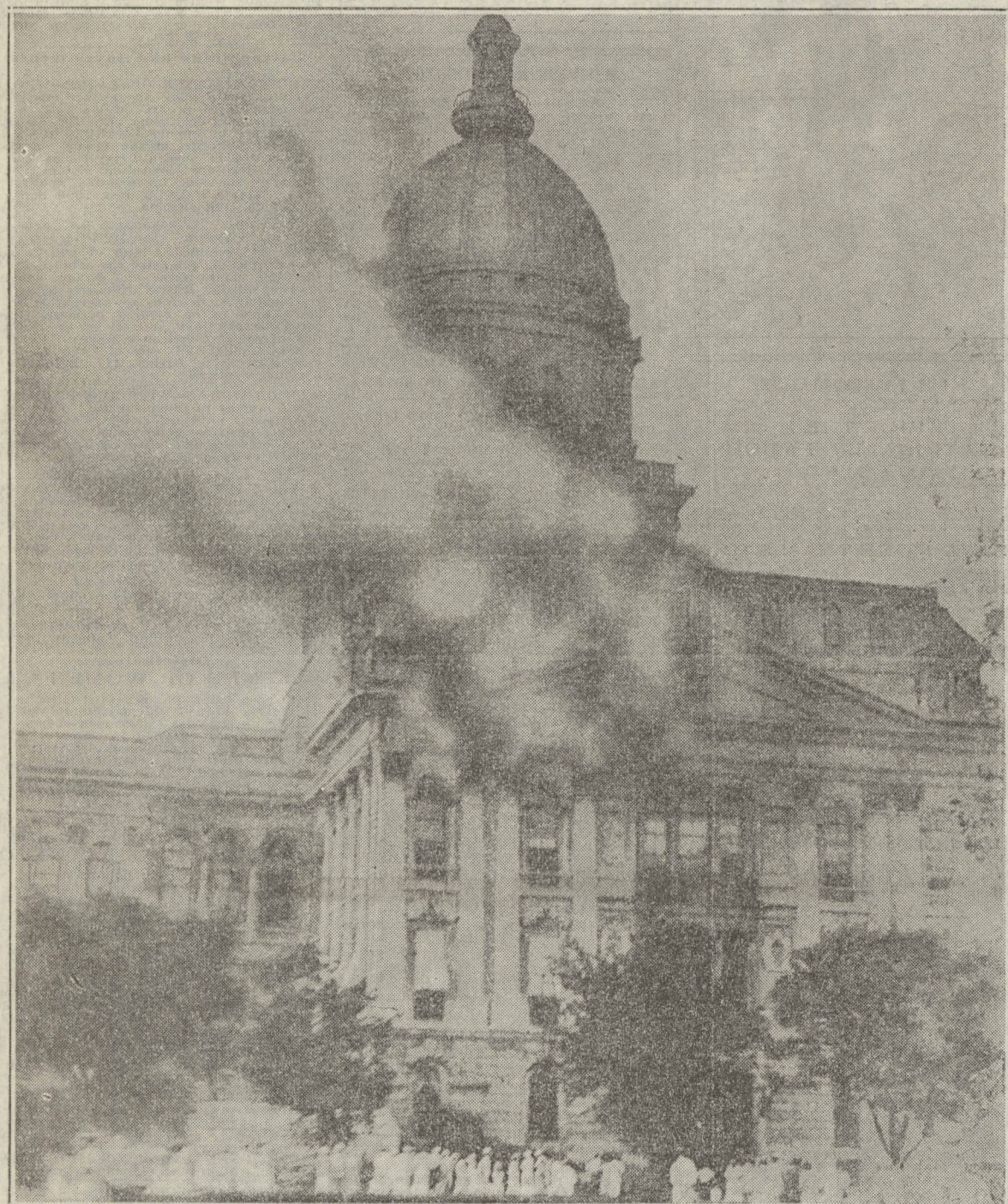


Capitol in Springfield Damaged by Fire—Repeal Convention Today—Boy Dies in Double Tragedy

FIRE ATTACKS STATE CAPITOL AT SPRINGFIELD; DAMAGE NEARLY \$100,000. 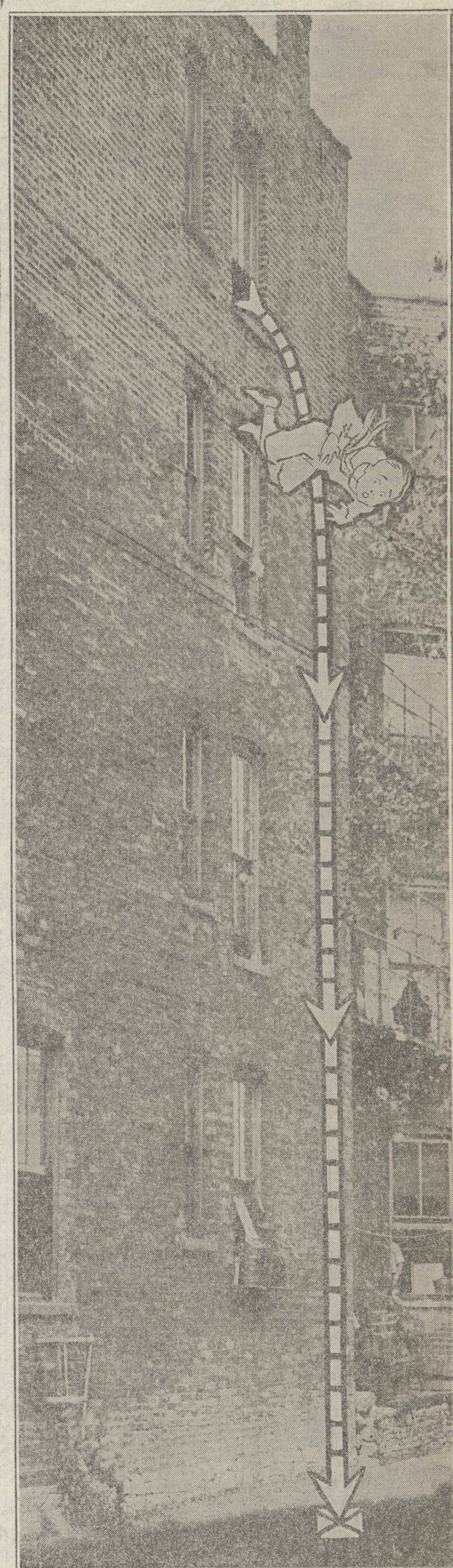

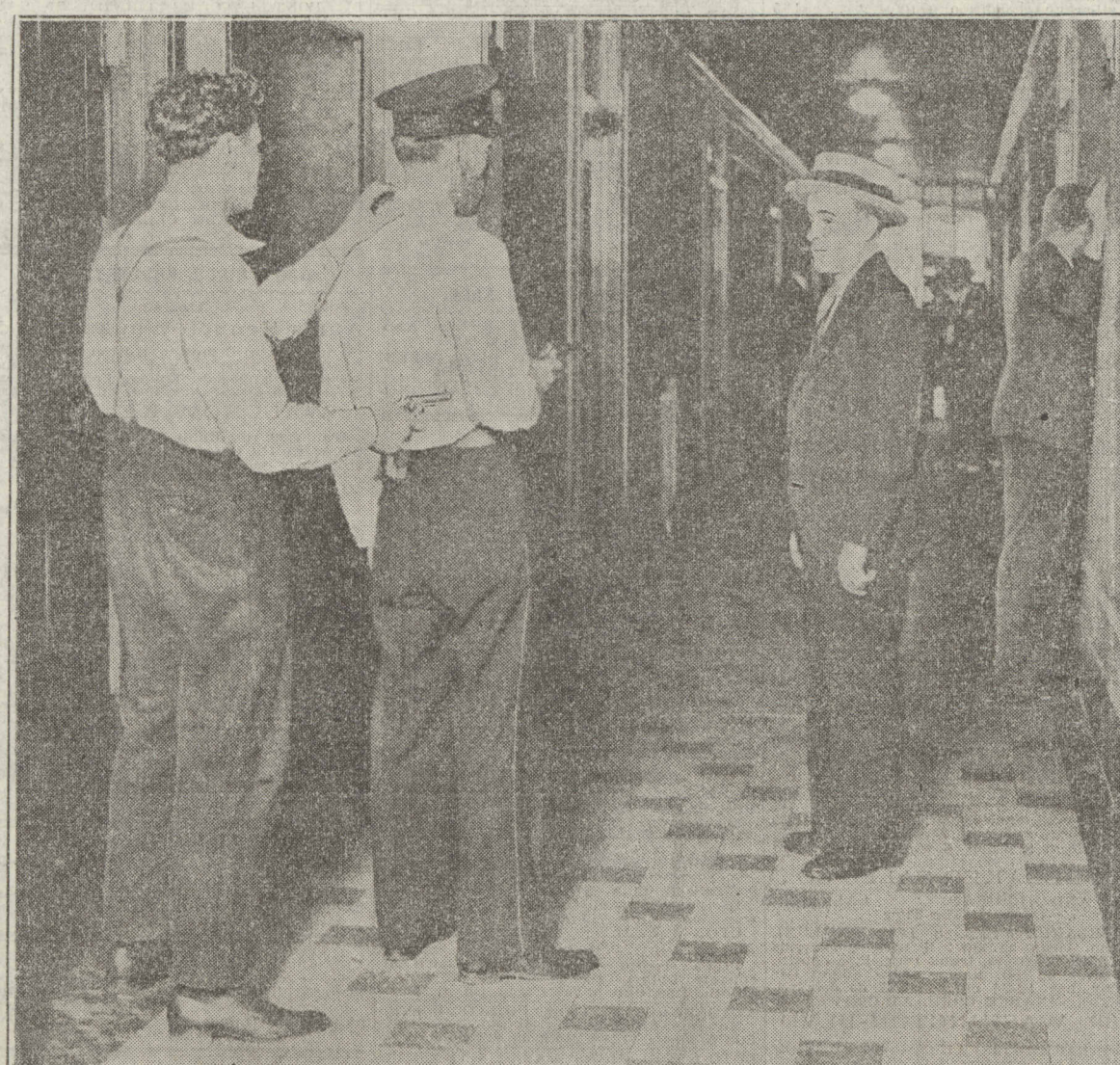

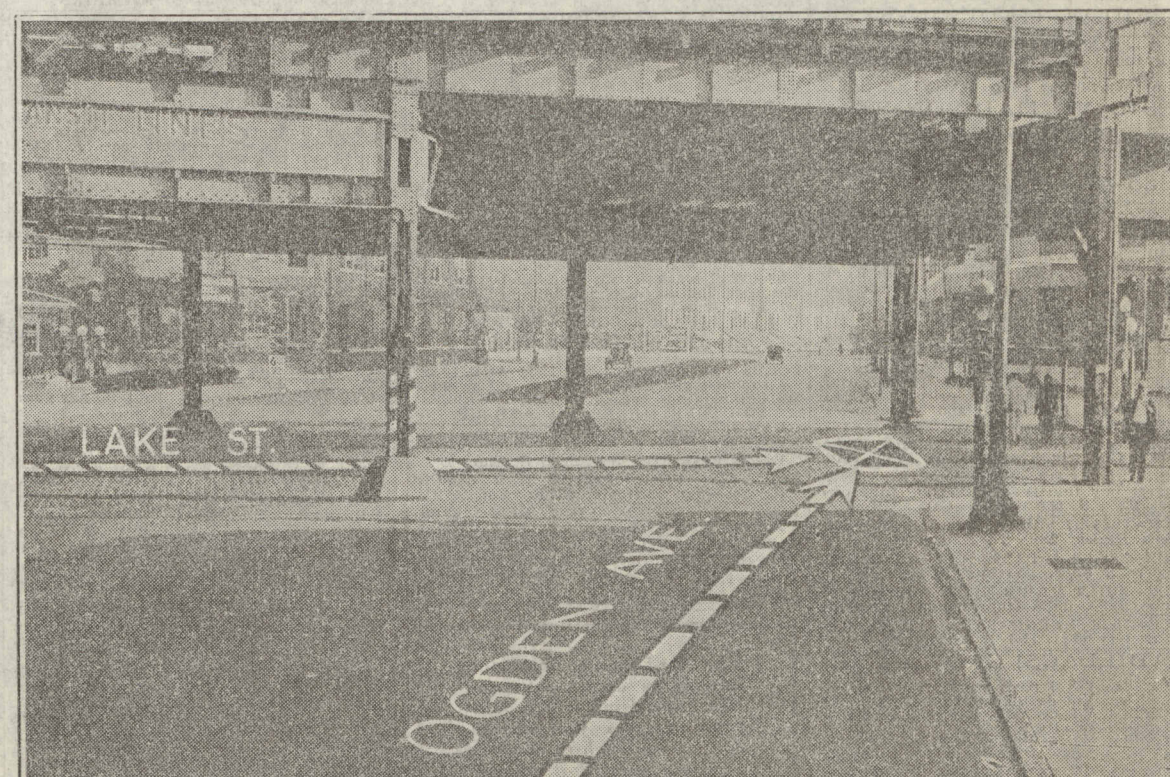
