

Snead's 64 Leads Chicago Open—43,233 Cheer Cubs' Victories—Yachts Race to Mackinac Island



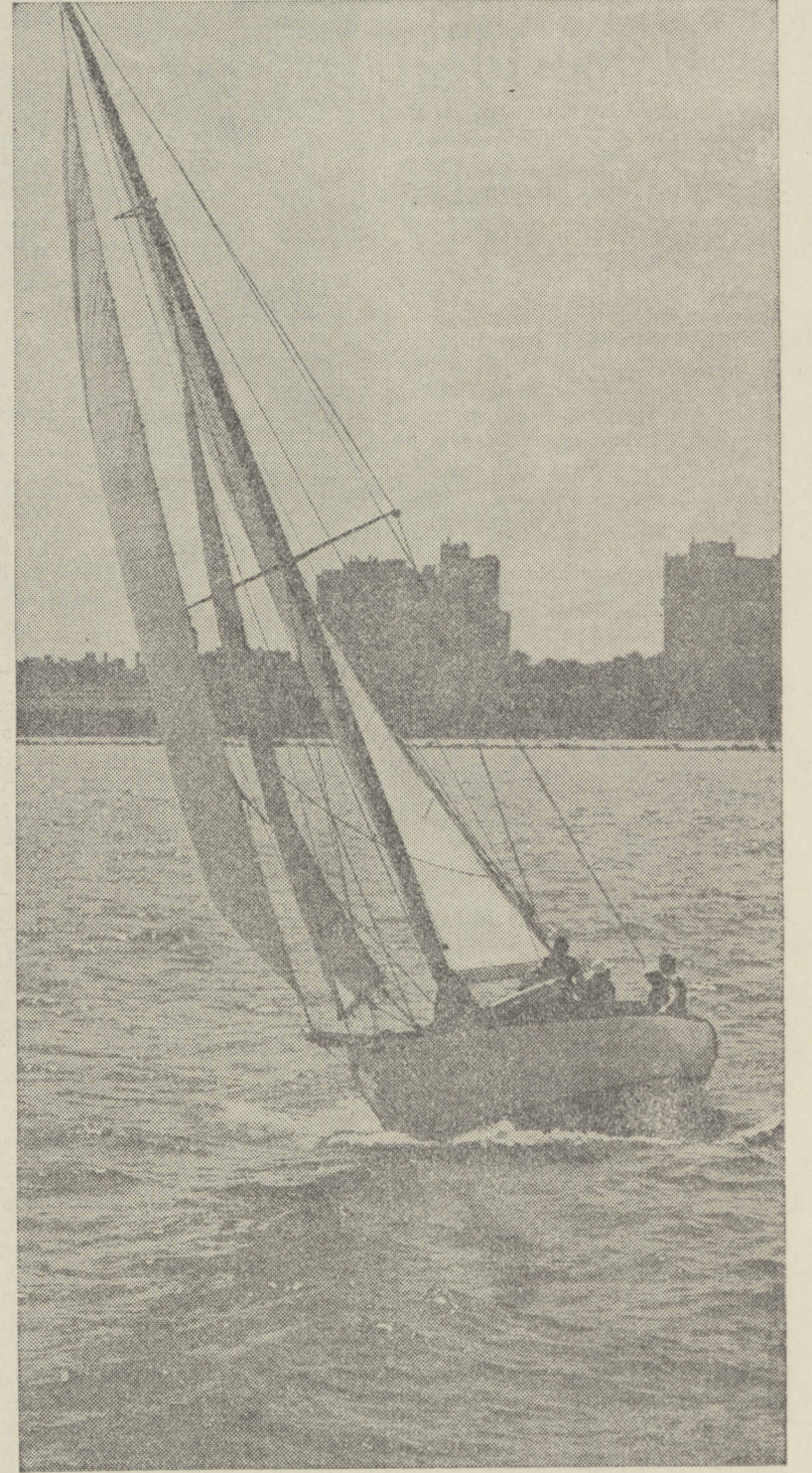

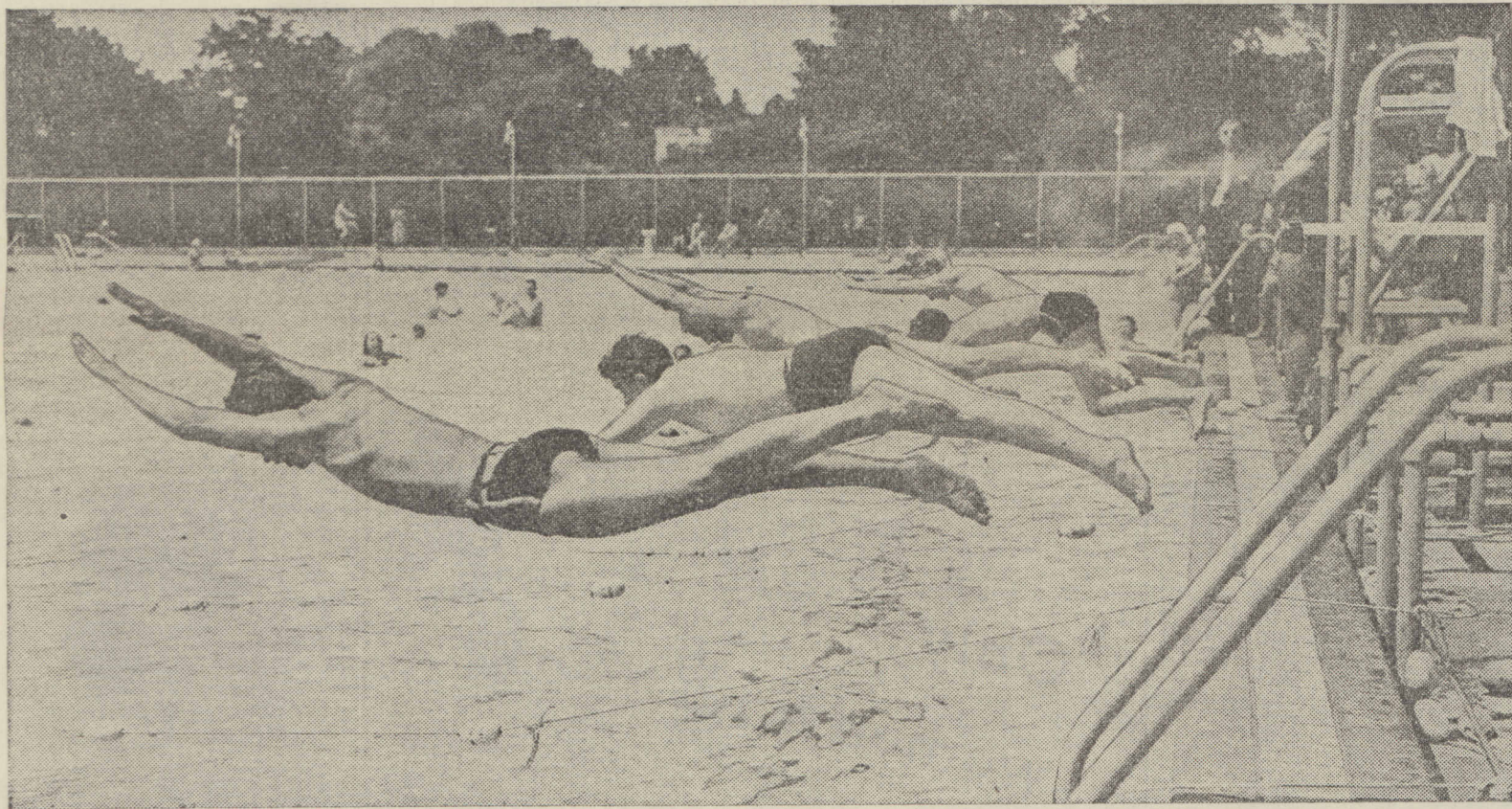

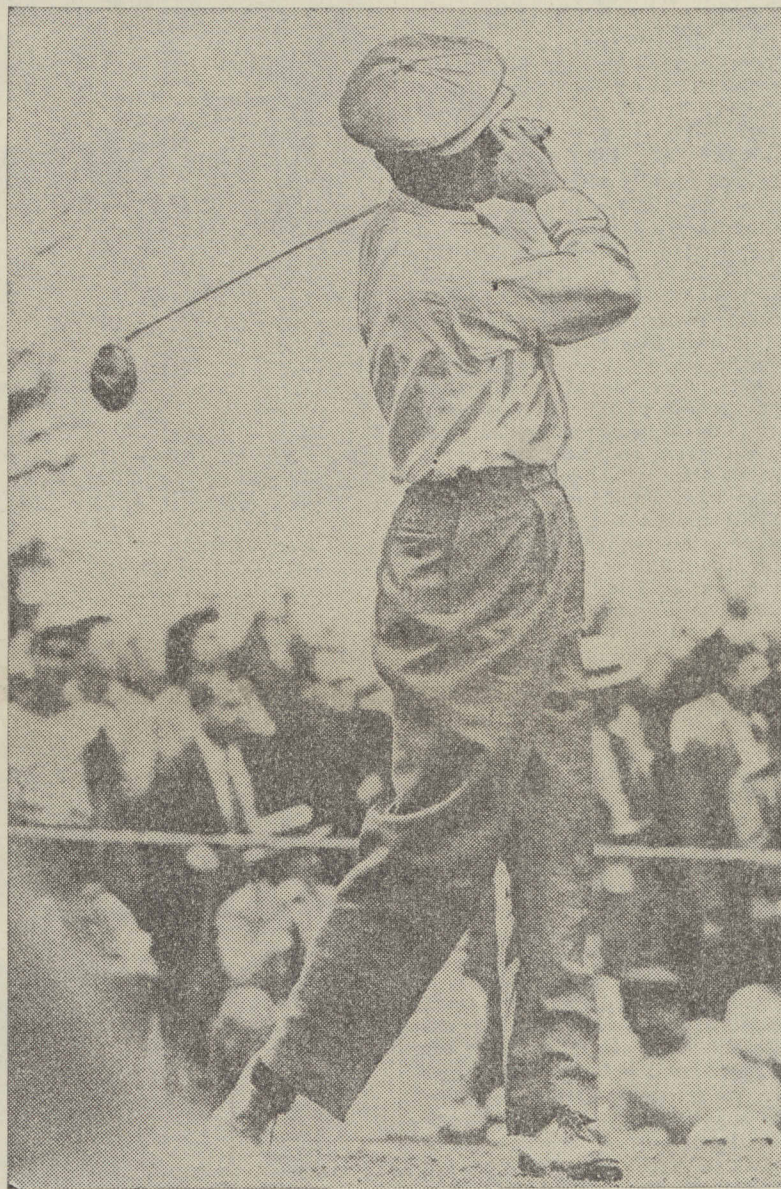

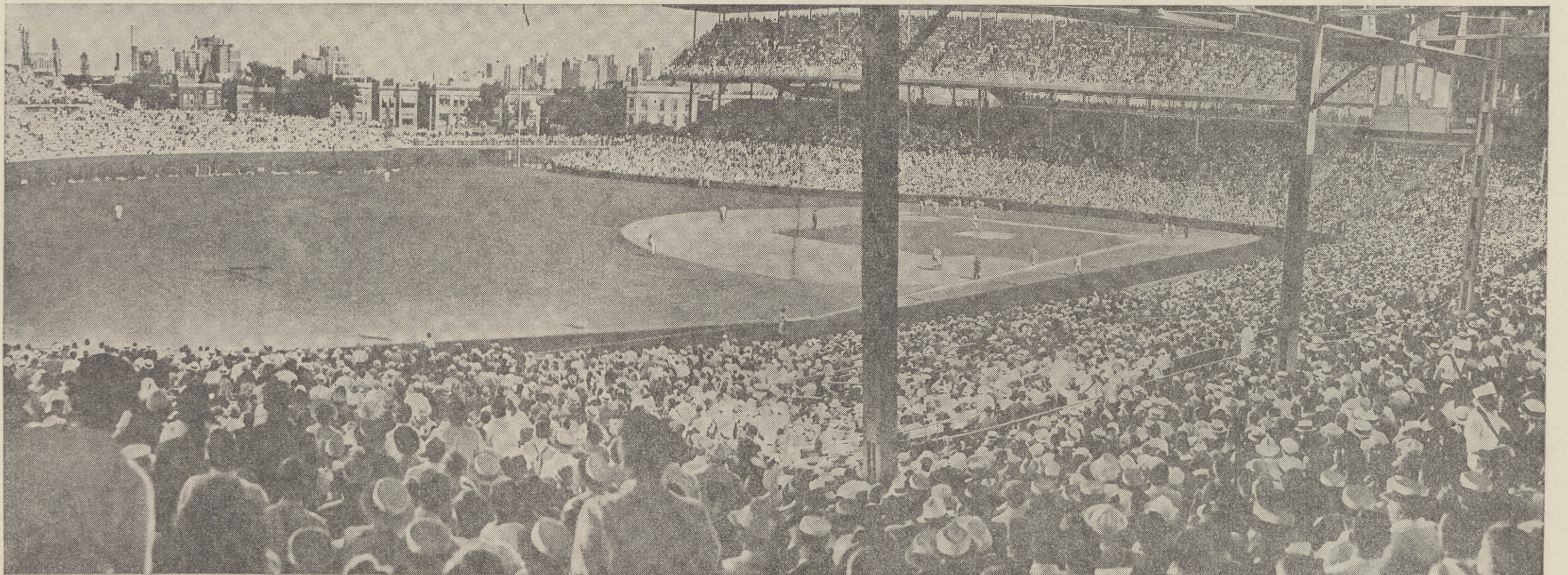
